




A Science and Maths exhibition on the theme -

The temperature sensor has been coded in such a way that, if the temperature is above 45 degrees (Celsius) then the buzzer would go off and if someone doesn't come, in 10 seconds to the rescue of the trapped person then the driver's window would roll down automatically, as the motor would also be coded by the Arduino and would be connected to the Arduino, which would allow air to enter the car.

The system would be connected to the door open/close sensor, which is in almost every car, so if the door is opened then the system will automatically turn off.


<u>Learning Uutcome</u>

- In the VC there was an exchange of views and thoughts on 'Art of Expression'.

# <u>Khan Academy Tab Lab</u>

Khan Academy Modules were introduced in Class VI as a pilot project in the academic session 2017-18 and now is an intrinsic part of regular curriculum. Khan Academy Modules were aimed at providing the hands on experience to all the students. Special training sessions were arranged for the Maths faculty in order to train them the integration of the programme in teaching / learning process. The modules of Khan Academy are used for effective introduction and explanation of concepts of Mathematics. The question bank is given as home / weekend assignment to the students. The feature of Skill Summary is used for effective assessment of the students to find out the teaching learning gaps.

Students are enjoying solving questions from the assignment sheets provided in the module. They are able to check their score immediately after completing the sheets which keeps them motivated. They are also able to continue these assignments at home as well.

Khan Academy provides an alternate to slow learners who otherwise have Maths phobia. They were motivated to attempt Mathematical problems using tablets and could solve around 70% problems.

The Average score of Class VI in Periodic Test I is as below:Class VI A:21.02/25Class VI B:20/25Class VI C:19.40/25Class VI D:19.82/25The introduction of Tab Lab in collaboration with Khan's Academy has definitely helped in<br/>enhancing the interest of the students in Mathematics and has improved the scores in<br/>the subject considerably.

When our kids are online, they can be exposed to real dangers like identity theft, cyber bullying etc. The parents play the most important role to help their kids to take advantage of the Internet without falling victim to its risks.

Keeping this in mind a survey was conducted on Cyber Safety awareness for parents. For the benefit of the students the related handouts were uploaded on the school website for different classes . Classes III to V were assessed for 30 Marks Multiple Choice Question paper that was held in the month of October 2017. After analysing the results of survey and test conducted the school also organized a workshop on Cyber Crime and Online Safety for the students and parents of classes IV & V. The workshop was conducted by Ms Neha Kapoor, from Centre for Development of Advanced computing (C-DAC) the centre is a premier R&D organization of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology. They got an insight on the various cyber laws initiated by the government of India to cease the cybercrime in the country. For parents they also gave anecdotes of some crimes of past and briefed new ways devised to protect themselves by learning how to create strong passwords. Parents seemed enthusiastic as they discussed how to stay safe while using plastic money.

(a)<u>Laboratory</u>. The Labs are fully equipped with necessary material / apparatus. Practical classes in Gen Science Lab (IV – VIII), Physics, Chemistry and Biology Labs (IX – XII) are being conducted on a regular basis as per the Time Table.



# (b) <u>Library</u>. Total stock of books in the two libraries put together is **23,862** an increase of **56** books since the last report.

- School Transport
   Presently 15 routes of Primary and Senior School and 6 Routes of the Pre Primary Wing are operational, out of which 12 routes operate in and around Noida and O1 each on Indirapuram, Ghaziabad and Delhi stretch. The State and Supreme Court guidelines are strictly adhered.

The school in association with KleverMind has initiated tracking services of the School transport. Parents of all the bus users have been given login credentials for regular tracking of their ward's bus and receive the SMS regarding the following :

- Real time tracking of the busNotifications of trip start and end
- Notifications of attendance at the time of arrival and departure
- Stop Notifications (once geofencing is done across all routes by the bus attendant/supervisor)

### PTA Meeting

The records of all the meetings are minuted in the proper Minutes Register as well as released on the teacher portal for reading purposes



The Board of Management, CES in its meeting dated 20 June, 2018 stated that the establishment cost of Delhi / NCR schools is very high and with the implementation of 7th CPC, there is an overall increase by almost 24% in the salary of teaching and non teaching staff.

It was decided that w.e.f. 01 July, 2018, all regular employees of the school instead of being paid Provident Fund a 12% of Basic and DA will be reduced to a statutory limit of Rs.1,800/- per month. It has been confirmed by the Legal Cell, CES that there is a no legal violation in implementation of the above.
