Brief and clear description of Activity that will help in attaining the projected learning outcomes	Model United Nations Conference will be conducted where students will work together and discuss 'The Rohingya Conflict' in Myanmar. The students will represent delegates of different countries. Students will research the theme and share their findings with the partner school for comparison. They will put forward their countries stand on the agenda keeping in mind various foreign policies of the nations. The delegates will discuss the agenda and debate on the topic. It will be followed by a brain storming session to prepare a 'Draft Resolution'. They will collect the information from various news channels. In October, students will visit the High Commission of Sri Lanka to interact with available resource persons. The partner school will likewise visit the Indian High Commission in their country. The reports will be shared. The students will be judged by the executive board members of the conference. Based on their performances they will be judged as 'best delegate' Report writing will be done on the proceedings which will be published as a 'newsletter'. Scanned copy of the newsletter will be shared with the partner school.


## Deviation from the action Plan

The issue: Myanmar considers Rohingya's as illegal Muslim Bengali immigrants, despite the fact that many of them have resided in Rakhine province of







Myanmar for centuries. Myanmar government even refuses to grant them citizenship status, and as a result they do not have legal documentation, effectively making them stateless. They are also restricted from freedom of movement, state education and civil services jobs.



#### The Rights of Rohingya-

The delegate of the republic of Albania was talking about the importance of Buddhism in Myanmar, the delegate talked about how Rohingyas are reprimanding. She says that if Myanmar Govt. stops discriminating against them then they will also stop. Also she points out that India is deporting Rohingyas because it thinks that some of them might be terrorist or has connection with terrorist camps in Pakistan.

Next moderated caucus started with the topic Violence faced by women and children, in which the delegate of the Federal Republic of Nigeria talks about how 60% of Rohingyas are women and children who have faced violence being conducted against them, which he continues by telling a story about the same. Speaking next, the delegate of Croatia talks about the children of Rohnigyas and Rakhine state who got unregistered after the violence of 2012 in Myanmar. Next was delegate of china, who tells an instance about how a Rohingya woman was fleeing her country when on her way 6 men captured her, raped her and then killed her brother and this leads to genocide Lastly delegate of Myanmar finally tells how Myanmar needs itself to be seen as a stable country and how it is ethnically diverse, then proceeds by saying how Rohingyas are now being given some rights. The delegate of Paraguay, says that Myanmar forces the recruitment of its children and how it violates the chapter 8 of section 359 of Myanmar constitution. On which The delegate of India raises a point, how section 359

applies to the citizen of its country and Myanmar does not recognize the Rohingyas as its citizen. The delegate of Albania also raises a question that, why India doesn't accept Rohingyas? To which, the delegate of India answers that it is already an overpopulated country and accepting refugees will only raise the ongoing conflict between Hindu and Muslims. And how it had only deported the unregistered Rohingyas.


