1. Content of the Workshop/Seminar-

The workshop aimed at creating awareness among the participants about the increase in compulsive behaviour to use the internet and mobile phone among children which ultimately leads to addiction to internet. It also highlighted the role of law in controlling cyber crime and how children can also be tried for misusing internet. the discussion also focused on ways of helping children not to be addicted to internet and gadgets also discussing the role of parents from preventing children from internet abuse as well as informing them about ways to keep their children safe.

2. Learning outcomes (Knowledge and Information) from the workshop/Seminar?

The programme informed me that internet addiction has not yet been recognized as a disorder by DSM-V but is under consideration to be labeled as one. The cyber expert highlighted that at time the law is being overly used which implicates the innocent, hence the need is to use the law amicably and not misuse it. The member from the Juvenile Justice Board, highlighted the importance of understand the process which leads adolescents into committing crime and misuse of technology. Thus, emphasizing the role of environment in neglecting the child which leads the child to get into crime and inappropriate activities.

- 3. Which topics or aspects of the workshop/Seminar did you find most interesting or useful?

 It was interesting to learn the ways by which parents and teachers could prevent children from misusing the internet and be safe. such as keeping the computer in an open place which can be monitored rather than keeping it in a secluded corner or room, enabling firewalls, using genuine and original versions of anti viruses, creating multiple login accounts to log in the computer and being the admin who could control the setting of various accounts.

We can initiate a dialogue with students discussing the above mentioned ways to prevent themselves from being a victim of internet abuse or refraining from being a perpetrator. A guideline can also be shared with the parents about the role of parents to ensure internet safety of children.
