LIBYAN CRISIS; RESORTING TO PEACE

Soon after the general procedures of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), the GSL began where the countries discussed about the political as well as the economical crisis in Libya. The discussion revolved around the Military Intervention in Libya which took place in the year 2011 as well as about the Libya Civil War which started in 2014 and is still continuing.

During the discussion, the delegates of Italy put up a question regarding the pressure of ISIS and what does the country Libya need to do to combat this terrorist group. The delegates of Libya replied to this question that they needed allied military forces and resources from other countries to help exterminate ISIS for the long run. The main points that came up and were clearly highlighted during the discussion of GSL were that the terrorists groups in Libya were given too much power and the lives of civilians were in danger. The delegates of countries like the republic of China and Senegal argued that Libya's affair was one which did not need any International recognition and was a domestic affair.



The United States of America, Uruguay and Sweden appealed that civilians of Libya didn't have anyone to protect them from violence and poverty. Thus, this issue had to be addressed and looked upon internationally. The chairperson, Mr. Konrad Rohr, explained all the delegates a political concept which was developed by the Canadian International Commission known as RTP (Right To Protection). This concept stated that if a country is not able to protect its civilians anymore, the international committee can step in and take the measures needed to protect the civilians. It is not a legal concept.



The delegates of Italy addressed that it had taken the migrants from Libya and help reduce human trafficking. The delegate of Paraguay, says that Myanmar forces the recruitment of its children and how it violates the chapter 8 of section 359 of Myanmar constitution.
