- 'BICS'-BASIC INTER PERSONAL COMMUNICATION SKILLS.(This level of language comes in 3-4 years)
- 'CALP'- COGNITIVE ACADEMIC LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY. (Takes 5-7 years to develop)

The language components that are as follows:

- AURAL COMPREHENSION (An active skill required for effective language learning; connected to speech perception-sound & word recognition.)
- COMPOSITION (This refers to the ability to write stories by using the given clues in the form of pics. & oral instructions.); encouraging creative cognition.
- LOGICAL REASONING (This addresses the thinking ability of students & helps build up fundamental skills such as acquisition of information, forming associations, comparing& sequencing the information.)
- VERBAL REASONING (This assesses the student's ability to understand & use concepts of words to recognize subject vocabulary.)
- VISUAL UNDERSTANDING (This checks the student's ability to understand & follow a variety of visuals to recognize subject vocabulary.)
- 4. How will you implement the knowledge & techniques acquired to your subject?

The above components can be followed to develop aural/visual comprehension, logical/verbal reasoning & composition.

- Teach students to listen to the language, initially; Communication will be followed; gradually writing skills will arise.
