
Cyber Security Survey @ ICT Club



Unfortunately, strangers also have access to these conversations, pictures, and videos. When our kids are online, they can be exposed to real dangers like identity theft, cyber bullying etc. The basic idea of this survey was to create awareness on how much the students are attached to the electronic media, rather than being involved in outdoor activities. Students are more social on the social media and lesser in their day to day lives. The parents play the most important role in the upbringing of their child and can help their kids take advantage of the Internet without falling victim to its risks, hence they need to be updated and made aware of all the safety measures they can take for online safety and keep on discussing the Dos and Don'ts on the internet with their child.

A survey was conducted on Cyber Safety awareness on 5th August 2017. The students of classes IV & V gathered data from this survey and processed it further in order to draw inferences under the guidance of their ICT teachers. The results were alarming and are herewith shared with you.





About 41% of students play outdoor games less than 5 hours a week whereas 56% of them spend more than 7 hours a weak with the electronic media.



Only 38% parents do not use Parental controls on electronic devices.



50% of the students know the passwords of the parents mobile phones.
