PTM

The PTM for Classes M-I to Cls XII was held on O1 Aug 15 and the average attendance of the parents was 90% (approx.). The result of the F-I, Assessment Time Table (Class wise) are in the process of being uploaded on the Parent Portal.



CBSE Results

The results of the AISSCE (CI XII) and AISSE (CI X) held in Mar 15 were declared on 25 May 15 and 28 May 15 respectively. Since then, a detailed analysis of the result have been circulated to all members. However, a brief report is reproduced hereunder for easy reference.

Class XII

SCHOOL CLUBS









A. LIFE SKILLS

Life skills activities are conducted in the class rooms where in the teachers act as felicitators, students are divided into groups for project presentations on socially relevant and sensitive topics like gender sensitivity, illiteracy, child abuse, disability etc. This helps not only in inculcating important values but also equipping students with the very essential life skills.

B. CATCH THEM YOUNG
