Remedial Teaching

Given the significant contribution of Mathematics to modern society and people's lives, the Maths Dept of the school based on the data and results of 2016-17 has been asked to develop a Mathematics Intervention Programme as a priority to assist students who require further support to develop their Conceptual Understanding, Procedural Knowledge and Computational Skills in Mathematics called DECODING MATHEMATICS. The programme starts w.e.f. 01 July, 17 which includes:

- (a) Careful assessments with detailed documents of records to identify students needs.
- (b) Appropriate intervention and progress of child in Mathematics.
- (c) Our approach also involves sharing of Educational Research and teaching pedagogies learnt by the staff at Inservice Training Centre and focus on practical action plan.
- (d) Significant amount of planning has been done, parent and student interviews are being conducted and the dates for Orientation Programme have been decided.

(e) The programme 'Decoding Maths' will address the problems of students from Classes IV – VIII, only for those students who experience :

- 1) Incomplete mastery over number facts,
- 2) Computational skill weaknesses
- 3) Difficulties in making corrections and transferring knowledge and skills
- 4) Incomplete understanding of the language of Mathematics; visual, spatial and perceptual difficulties
- 5) Poor sense of numbers.

The teaching strategies under the supervision of School Secretary, SMC & Director, Inservice Training Centre will include revision of syllabus, altered time table, focused and structured work sheets that specifically address a learning problem, altered class room environment, use of relevant technology based resources, strong partnership with parents, regular evaluation and re-inforcement by reporting on progress for individual student progress.

Based on quantitative data in the subject Mathematics of final examination – 2016-17, 20 students from each class (III-VIII), in total, 100 students have been registered for Decoding Mathematics Programme.

Formative Assessment

- The evaluation of the final round of the Weekly Cycle Test in respect of Primary classes concluded on 21 Feb, 17 and on 06 Feb, 30 Jan and 23 Jan, 17 for Middle, Secondary and Sr Secondary School respectively.
- For the new academic session (2017-18), the weekly assessments for the Primary School and Sr Secondary school began on 25 April and 10 April, 2017 respectively..

Summative Assessment

The final examination for Cls V – VIII and XI commenced on 15 Feb, 17 and concluded on 03 Mar, 17. Mock Test for Classes IX & X were conducted during this period. CI IX & X Summative-II Examination began on 08 Mar, 17 and concluded on 28 Mar, 17.

PTM

PTM for the session 2016-17 for Cls Pre Primary to Class-VIII & XI was held on 18 Mar 17 and for Cl IX was held on 09 Apr, 17.

Monthly Assignments

- Assignment Booklets for Pre Primary I & II (April May & July) Creative and innovative theme based activity sheets as per the syllabus planned were designed by the teachers and compiled in the form of Assignment Booklets.
- With a view to recapitulate the lessons taught, assignments were given to all students of Primary classes for the month of April, 2017. The Holiday HW for the Summer Vacation is in the process of being uploaded on School website.

Time Table is being strictly adhered to.

- Coaching in various Sports and Games is held regularly. Regular Mass PT and Stretch Time for Primary and Senior school students is being held as per the schedule. Sports trials for selection of school teams (Primary & Sr School) in various games and sports are on under the supervision of the Sports Director and the Physical Education Department of the school.

Physical Fitness Programme

for session 2017-18 has been carried out and the data is in the process of being uploaded on the student portal.

Centre for Scholastic Integration

Special efforts are being taken to integrate the students enrolled with learning disability.

CBSE Examination and Evaluation

- The school was a centre for AISSE & AISSCE Examination under which 714 regular students of Classes X & XII appeared w.e.f. 09 Mar, 2017 to 28 April, 2017.
- Also, the evaluation of Answer Scripts of AISSCE in English, Accounts, B.St, Biology and Mathematics, under the aegis of CBSE, Dehradun, with Principal as Chief Nodal Supervisor was held in School premises w.e.f. 21 march, 2017 to 28 April, 2017.

Pre Primary-I Orientation Day

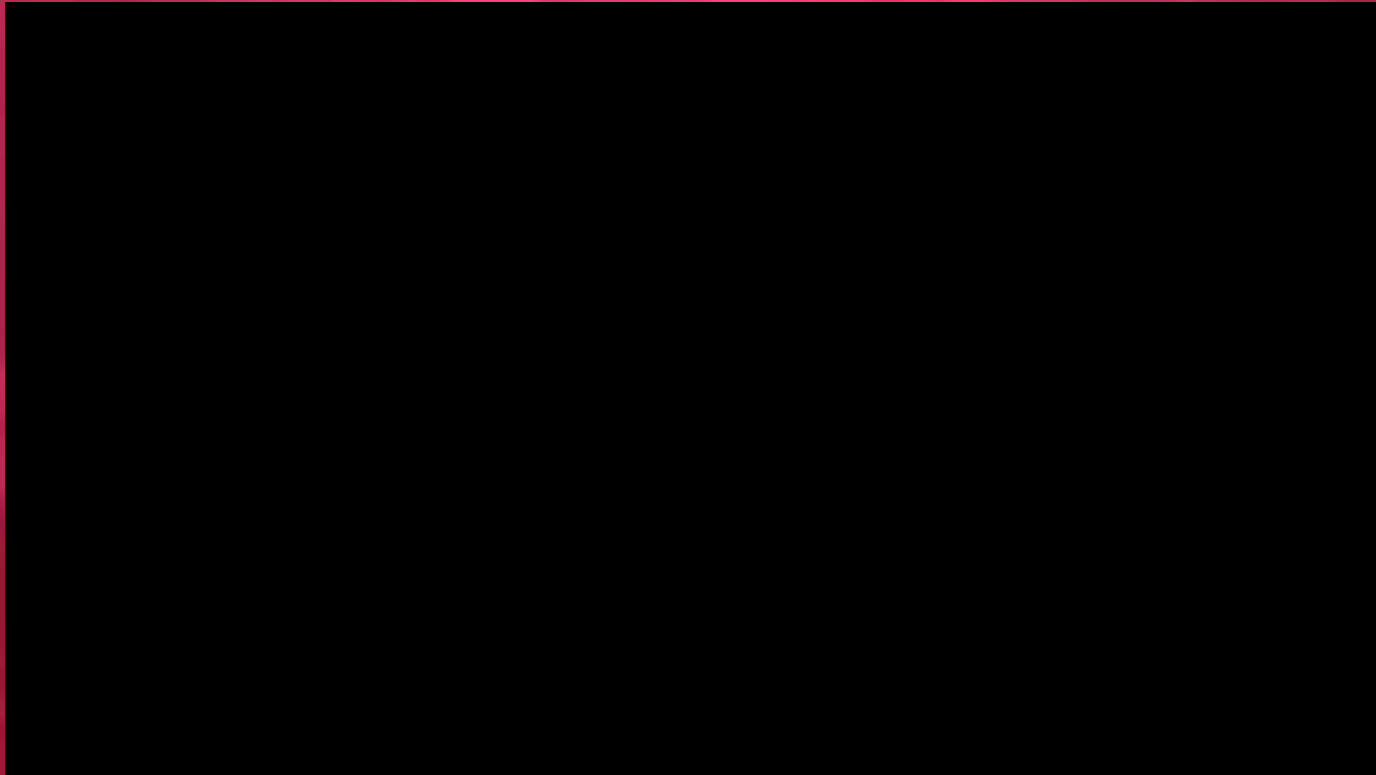

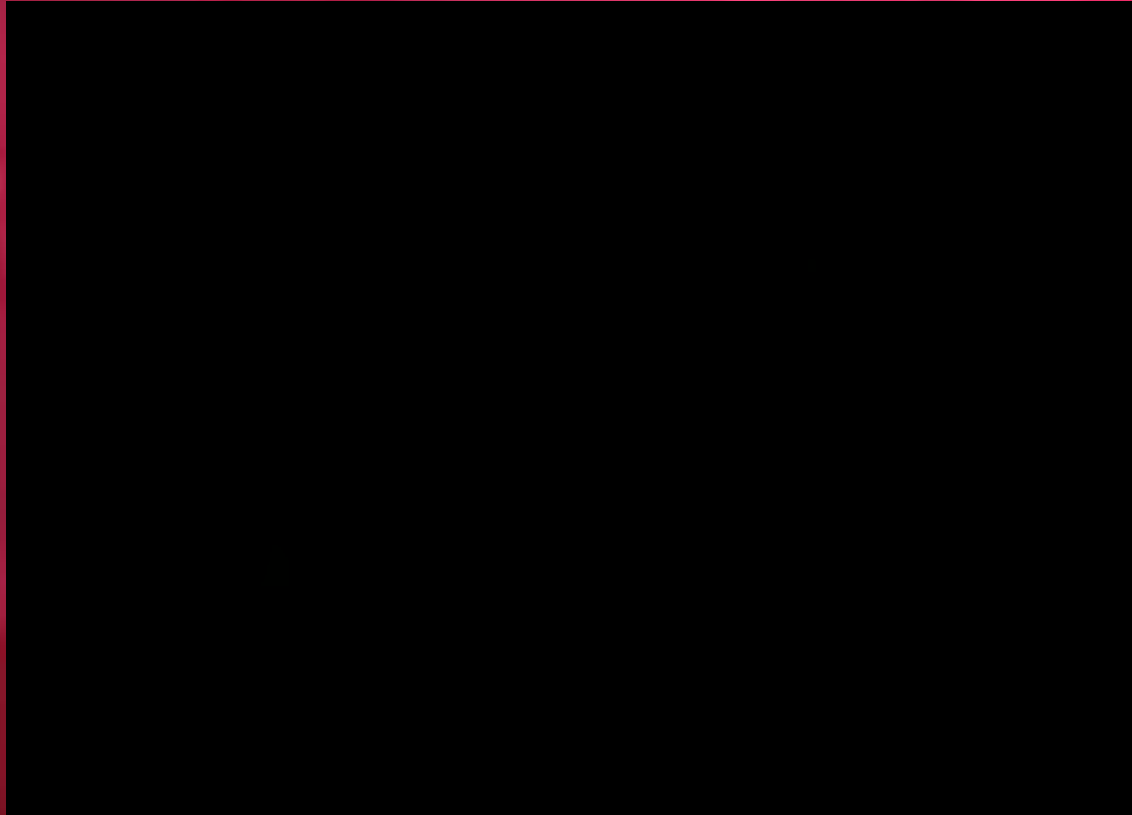


ISA Activities

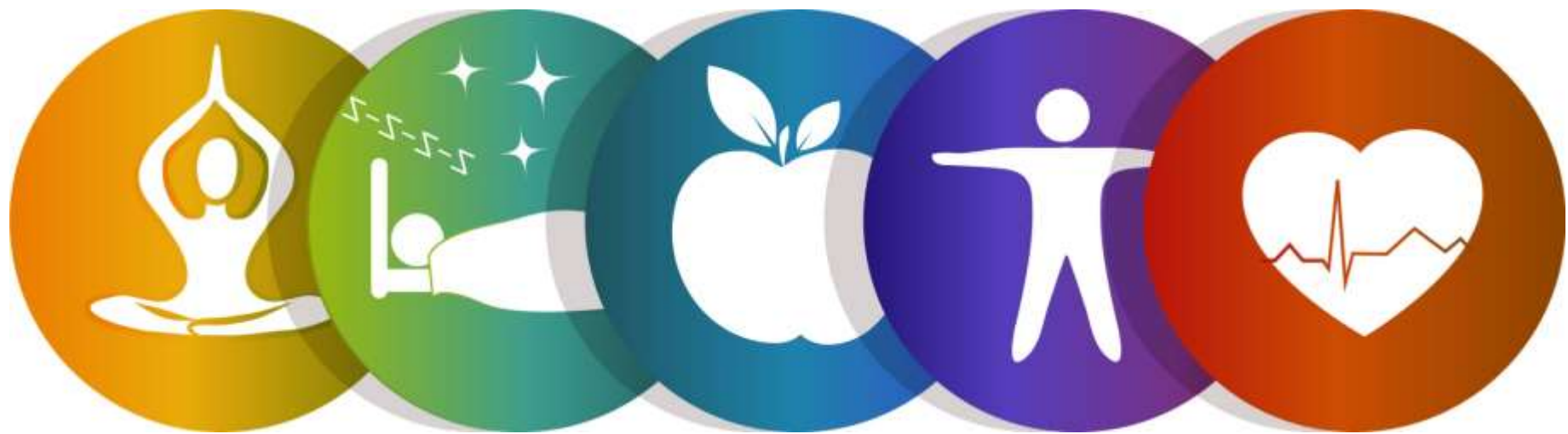

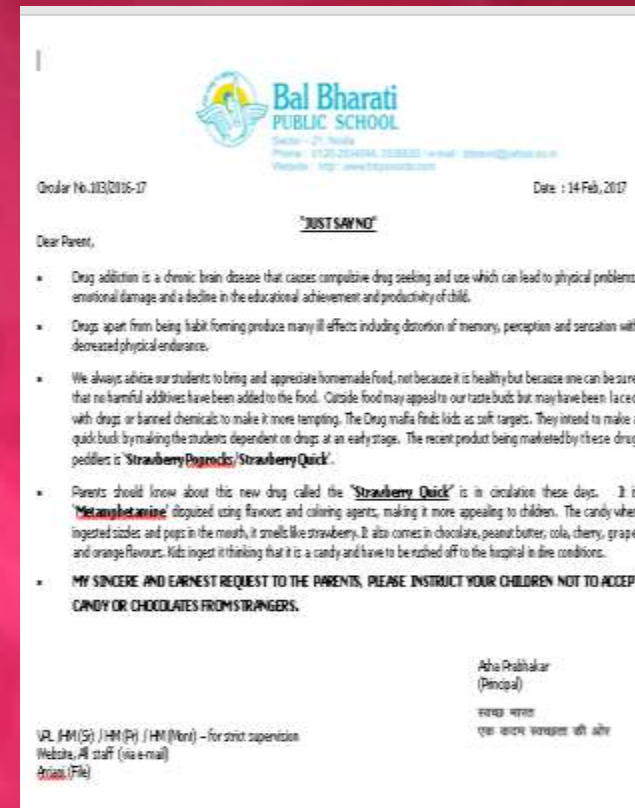


Health & Awareness Club

EAT IRON – KICK ANEMIA

Dear Parent,

As per circular received from UP Government all Private, Government and Government aided Schools have been directed to administer 100 mg I.F.A (Iron/ Folic Acid) blue big tablet to all children of age between 10-19 years on every Monday on a weekly basis.

Iron gives people energy and protects a child's cognitive capacity. In young children, iron deficiency is due to increased iron requirement during periods of rapid growth. When iron deficiency is severe enough, children can develop anemia. With anemia, there are insufficient red blood cells to carry oxygen from the lungs to rest of the body and it causes debilitating fatigue.

Children who suffer from anemia have delayed psychomotor development and impaired performance; in addition they have 5-10 point deficits in intelligence quotient. Iron deficiency can cause significant central nervous system damage even in the absence of anemia.



The WHO's global prevalence of anemia estimates that 114.7 million children have anemia from iron deficiency worldwide. Our country faces the dual dilemma of under and over nourishment. Our mission at BBPS Noida is to bring down the cases of obesity and malnutrition to zero. Eat Iron rich foods such as Red meat, poultry, Sea food, peas, beans, Dark green leafy vegetables such as spinach, Dried fruits such as Raisins and apricots, Iron fortified cereals, breads and pastas.

This initiative for controlling adolescent anemia is an implementable, effective and sustainable nation building exercise with far reaching benefits in terms of healthier future generations.
