प्रस्तुत वी.सी के माध्यम से छात्रों को महिलाओं के विषय में अनेक ऐसी बातों का ज्ञान हुआ जिससे वे अनभिज्ञ थे ,पहले वे केवल अपने ही देश के महिलाओं से संबंधित कानून के विषय में जानकारी रखते थे परंतु अब उन्हें संपूर्ण विश्व की महिलाओं के अधिकारों के विषय में नई-नई बातें पता चली । एक ऐसी चीज़ जिससे वे सबसे अधिक प्रभावित हुए वह है कि केवल भारत में ही नहीं वरन् पाकिस्तान में भी बेटी के जन्म को भाग्यशाली माना जाता है केवल इतना ही नहीं पाकिस्तान में बलात्कारियों को सीधा फाँसी देने का कानून है तथा वहाँ भी बहुत कम ऐसे गाँव हैं जहाँ की महिलाएँ अशिक्षित हैं तथा अपने अधिकारों से अनभिज्ञ हैं । दोनों देशों के कानून इस

विषय पर एक ही मत रखते हैं तथा पाकिस्तान में भी 18 वर्ष से पहले लड़की का विवाह करना कानूनी अपराध है। अतः कहा जा सकता है वी.सी. से छात्रों को ज्ञान प्राप्ति के साथ-साथ प्रेरणा भी मिली।

#### Facilitator's Feedback of Video Conference

#### Launch of Career Counseling Portal

Research shows that students and parents are aware of less than 15% career options after Class XII. This leads to parents & students missing many career opportunities. Also, they end-up making sub optimal career decisions. As mentors and important stakeholders in moulding the future of our students, Bal Bharati Public School, Noida understands these concerns equally well.

BBPS, Noida has initiated an online career counselling platform to help Class XII students to discover careers and higher education options while keeping the parent in the loop.

### **KHAN ACADEMY TAB LAB.**

Khan Academy Modules were introduced in Class VI as a pilot project in the academic session 2017-18 and now it is an intrinsic part of regular curriculum. Khan Academy Modules were aimed at providing the 'hands on experience' to all the students. Special training sessions were arranged for the Maths faculty in order to train them about the integration of the programme in teaching / learning process. The modules of Khan Academy are used for effective introduction and explanation of concepts of Mathematics. The question bank is given as home / weekend assignment to the students. The feature of Skill Summary is used for effective assessment of the students to find out the teaching learning gaps.

Students are enjoying solving questions from the assignment sheets provided in the module. They are able to check their score immediately after completing the sheets which keeps them motivated. They are also able to continue these assignments at home as well.

Khan Academy provides an alternate to slow learners who otherwise have Maths phobia. They were motivated to attempt Mathematical problems using tablets and could solve around 70% problems.

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The introduction of Tab Lab in collaboration with Khan Academy has definitely helped in enhancing the interest of the students in Mathematics and has improved the scores in the subject considerably.

#### **CENTRE FOR SCHOLASTIC INTEGRATION**

Special efforts are being taken to integrate the students enrolled with learning disability.

School Counselor along with the Special Educator (Sr) conducted a session on "World Autism Day", where a talk was delivered to create awareness about autism and a quiz was conducted to evaluate student's understanding about the topic.

Paintings of Geet Arora (IV) were sent for an exhibition with the theme "Views from Planet Autism and Art Exhibition" organized by Action For Autism, India.

Fortnightly reports were prepared and shared with the parents informing about activities done with the children during CFSI classes for Senior and Primary school.

The school on request of the parent(s) has permitted Shadow Teacher to provide additional support to the Autistic students through out the school day, academically and psychologically. The shadow teacher has been helping these Autistic kids to be organized and prepared for class, help these student with the approaches to learning. The school has been immensely benefitted by the collaborative efforts put in by the Special Educators and shadow teacher to meet the special needs of these children.

An Interactive PTM was held on 6<sup>th</sup> Oct, 2018 for the parents of primary and middle school students. The progress of the special education needs children and the goals developed for special education sessions for the coming months was discussed with the parents.

#### Multi-Sensorial Path :

Children with learning difficulties and other neuro-disorders are often distracted or find it difficult to pay attention in the class due to their sensory excitation and high neural activity or due to difficulty in processing.

To cater to such children, the school on an experimental basis has developed a multi-sensorial path. The path has colourful cutouts to help children learn pre-number skills, enhance gross motor skills, eye-hand coordination and improve their reading skills while calming down their high sensory needs. The path is proving to be beneficial in case of ADHD students.

#### Awards and Accolades:

YMCA, Nizamuddin hosted “**ABILITY UTSAV**” on 04 Dec, 2018 for the special needs students. These students secured I position in “Group Dancing” and III position in “Group Singing”. They were awarded medals and Certificate of Appreciation.

#### Astronomy Club

An **Overnight sky observation** for Module I Astronomy students was conducted on 20 Mar, 2018 at a premium site – **Astroport, Sariska** which is India's first Astronomy theme based resort. It provides a great sky viewing and is free from light, air and sound pollution. Students carried out extensive activities like locating star clusters, use of the planisphere, viewing satellites of planets, locating directions, using the Newtonian telescope etc.

**All India Asteroid Search Campaign (AIASC)** is one of the most prominent and much-awaited campaign, which is conducted in collaboration with **International Astronomical Search Collaboration** (IASC, Hardin-Simmons University, Texas, USA). **Students get the exciting opportunity to work with professional Astronomers and get access to real Astronomy data. Animesh Jha (IX) and Arnav Pandey (VII) have been registered for the above campaign.**

**Global Astronomy Month** is celebrated every year in collaboration with **Astronomers without Borders** worldwide by students. Students have made submissions of their work for the **online AstroArt Competition and Astro Poetry**

**Competition** .The theme for these competitions was space related subjects like astronomy, night sky, the universe etc. Results are awaited.

To encourage enrolment of students in the Astronomy Club, a presentation by SPACE was conducted for Primary and Middle School. As on date, the school has enrolled 157 students in the club. All club related activities for the above students shall commence w.e.f. 01 Sep, 2018.

SPACE conducted a half-day workshop for participants to download data and use software to successfully search for asteroids. The highly specialized training enhanced the skills required to analyze the astronomical data and make important observations.

Arnav Pandey (VIII) and Animesh Jain (IX) attended the training workshop on 17 May, 2018 at DPS International School, Saket. They have successfully made 10 preliminary discoveries which may get confirmed as potential asteroids on a later date.

***SPACE Explorers Workshops** is a collection of one day programme which give students a remarkable opportunity to participate, interact and experiment to find answers behind the mysteries of the Universe.*

#### **SESSION: HYDROROCKETRY**

**DATE: 1<sup>st</sup> Sept,2018**

Students were introduced to the idea of **rockets as a space vehicle** and how they work. Using plastic soft drink bottles, cardboard, tape, glue and other similar off the shelf material, students designed, constructed and launched simple hydro rockets. These work on the simple concept of physics ie, when water is forced out from the bottom of the rocket by air pressure, the upward force pushes the rocket upwards- **Newton's third law.** **The rockets were launched with the help of a simple wooden launcher in the school ground. The activity turned into an exciting competition as every child aimed to land his rocket to the farthest point in the ground.**

#### **SESSION: SCIENCE OF LIGHT**

**DATE: 15<sup>th</sup> Dec,2018**

Students were educated that **2015** was recognized as the “**International year of light**” that aimed to raise awareness of the achievements of light science, its applications and its importance to humankind. Students understood the various phenomena of light such as **reflection, refraction, total internal reflection, dispersion etc.** through hands-on experiments and recorded their observations in their hand booklets.

#### **SESSION: PROJECT PARIDHI**

**DATE: 22<sup>ND</sup> DEC,2018**

‘**Project Paridhi**’ is a flagship project of SPACE which was launched in 2010. The project is conducted 4 times a year on days of **Solstices** and **Equinoxes**. **Project Paridhi (Winter Solstice) on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2018 was attended by five student of the Astronomy Club at the beautiful heritage site – Qutab Minar.** Project Paridhi is a hands-on science activity in which participants measure the shadows cast by the Sun, and using trigonometry, they learn how to calculate the circumference of the Earth as done by the **Greek Astronomer Eratosthenes**, about 3000 years ago. Participants replicated the same activity and came up with an almost accurate measurement to their surprise.

#### **SESSION: COMET KITCHEN**

**DATE: 29<sup>th</sup> Dec,2018**

The workshop gave an insight into the mysterious world of comets. Students learnt about the structure, parts and orbit of a comet, how comets are formed, where do they come from, about various missions sent to study comets and the potential threat they pose to mankind. Finally the students were involved in a hands-on group activity where they cooked their own comet, with ingredients like soil, water, dry ice, ammonia and soya sauce which contained elements similar to a real comet.



## **SESSION: EVENING SKY OBSERVATION**

**DATE: 19<sup>th</sup> Jan, 2019**

In this workshop, students learnt about our nearest celestial neighbour- **LUNA (moon)** and solar system planets visible from Earth. Students learnt the difference between the **reflector** and **refractor** telescopes. They learnt to align the telescope towards the sky and observed the **Moon, the brightest star Sirius in the constellation – Canis Major**. They also identified a **star cluster and the red planet –Mars**.

### Interact Club

As the session 2017 – 18 came to a close, the Interact club appealed to the students of all classes to donate their old books and notebooks to be used by the lesser privileged students of various NGO run schools of Noida.

They say “sharing is caring”. To inculcate this thought in our lives, the students of classes VI – XII voluntarily contributed goodies and prepared gift hampers on the occasion of the Foundation Day of the school. These hampers were shared with students of GOKUL VIDYAPEETH run by the NGO SOUL and orphanage SAI KRIPA.
