

Skill Development Week


The new education policy focuses on development of skills among the learners.



Nehru Planetarium organized a preparatory 'Sun Projection' workshop on 12thDecember 2019 to enable the observation of the 'Annular Solar Eclipse' by students in their school campus on the 26th Dec'19.

The workshop included talks related to the Sun and eclipses, safe methods of observing the eclipse, guidance to the participating team for the construction and assembling of a simple refractor telescope to be used for Sun Projection.



A team of 10 students from Class VIII attended the workshop along with a skilled carpenter who understood the method of construction of the projection box.

The projection box was constructed and the telescope fitted on to it. Students also made pinhole cameras to view the eclipse.



In a creative activity Our Solar system, carried out for students on 21thDec'19, students identified objects in the solar system and created travel brochures or advertisements to attract future space tourists to their exotic destinations.



The students then used the information that they had gathered to create travel posters, brochures, television or radio commercials for their destinations which included valuable facts about their chosen objects. At the end, each team made its presentation.

SPACE Café (Classes III –V)

Students understood that food sent to space is a complete balanced diet and is specially processed and packed. Factors that help in choosing food items to be sent in space depends on the likes and dislikes of an astronaut (as choices vary from one region to another), the shelf life of the food item, the portion that can be consumed at one time (so that there are no leftovers to avoid contamination) and least volume of the food item.













The students got an opportunity to act as Food scientists for the day where they performed roles of Nutrition specialist, Food engineers, Food organizers, Spice engineers, Health managers in order to prepare the Astronaut Food Tray.

Hydrobot (Classes VI – VIII)

In this workshop, students were introduced to the concept of hydraulics in a very interactive manner. They learnt about the properties of fluid and how fluids can be used in hydraulic machines. They learnt about the application of hydraulics in space sciences.











The Environment Club initiated an e-waste collection drive from 10 to 20 Dec, 2019 for proper disposal and recycling of e-waste.







I could make out that it was a different place because I couldn't see any people just a counter with a manager, a menu card and a bell.

We walked up, he said, "Aha, you're here, Happy Birthday, and we hope we make your day memorable to you."

The manager smiled and asked us to follow him in a pathway which for some reason kept getting darker and darker, until a point I had to hold my husband because I could absolutely see nothing.

The manager now turned to us and said, "I am handing you over to our server for the day, Sampath."

Sampath greeted us warmly and began by saying, "As you can see; you can't see!"

"It's pitch dark already and there are no sources of light inside either; please hold my hand, trust me, you are safe with me and I'll take you to your table."

We did as he told us, holding each other, we touched the walls to support and not trip and as promised, we were safe and reached our table.

Sampath brought in our meals in 10 minutes, and asked us to enjoy!

I thought " Enjoy what .. Darkness?"

And for the next 45 minutes, we ate in complete darkness!! "We fumbled, we mumbled" and we had to feel the roti, figure out the sabzi, chutney, water, etc.

Not being able to see my husband, just able to hear each other out,

It was difficult in the beginning but as time went on , we completed our delicious meal & it was a unique experience indeed! When we were done, we called Sampath who came promptly, we stood, placed our hand in his and walked ahead and as we headed back out towards the light I was relieved; And I could finally see the back of Sampath's head, and THEN HE TURNED! My jaw dropped instantaneously when I finally and actually saw Sampath I A visually-disabled man! No eyes whatsoever! Sampath whispered softly, "What you experienced was not only how disabled the blind people are but also how uniquely able we are!"


While I almost tripped multiple times, couldn't bear the darkness beyond few minutes; they live like this all their lives!






The Ultimate Icons of our country are the Armed Forces Jawaans who sacrifice their lives for the country.

Bal Bharati Public School, Noida joined hands with an NGO to sort, segregate, repair, and pack the shoes for distribution to the less privileged.



Their model on "Water Friendly Mopper" won accolades from all won accolades Efforts are on quarters. Efforts are the to further improvise the prototype.


Inspire Award Scheme


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

The 19th National Cyber Olympiad was held on 26 Dec, 2019 in which 42 students from Classes III to X participated from the school. Results are awaited.


Vidyarthi Vigyaan Manthan (VVM)






SPECIAL OCCASIONS

Safety & Security

Disaster Management, Fire Safety & Security Assessment

With the purpose to inculcate the culture of preparedness and to help in building its capacity in institutionalizing disaster management framework, triple assessment including Disaster Management, Fire Safety and Security was carried out by the team of BNK Crisis and DM Services, New Delhi on 26 November 2019. Brig B.K. Khanna, Senior Specialist (Training and Capacity Development) NDMA and a CBSE approved resource person carried out the Triple Safety Audit. As per the report, most of the gaps have been rectified. The systems are in place to mitigate perceived contingencies, emergencies, accidents and disasters. It is said that the disaster management preparedness is never foolproof and there is always a scope for improvement.



School Transport
