The online Round I Assessment / Pre Term for Classes VI - X was held online through Google Forms from 01 Jun, 2020 to 13 Jun, 2020.

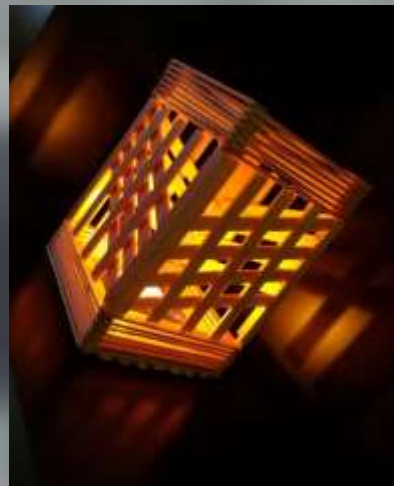
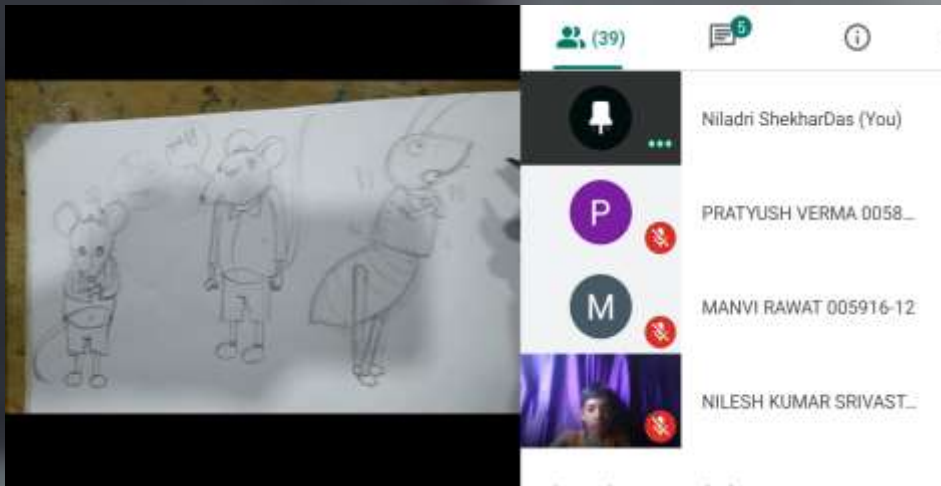
The online Round I Assessment for Classes XI - XII was held online through Google Forms from 26 May, 2020 to 29 Jun, 2020.

565 students from Classes VIII to XII enrolled for the same and are now certified App Makers.

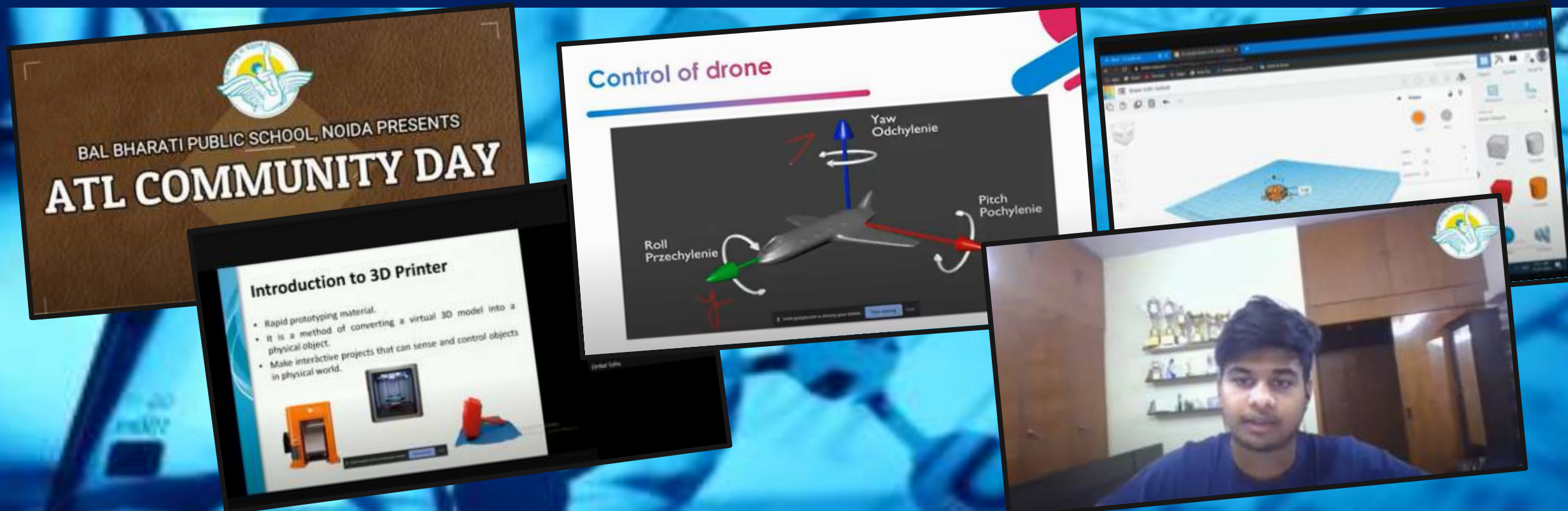


ATL Community Day

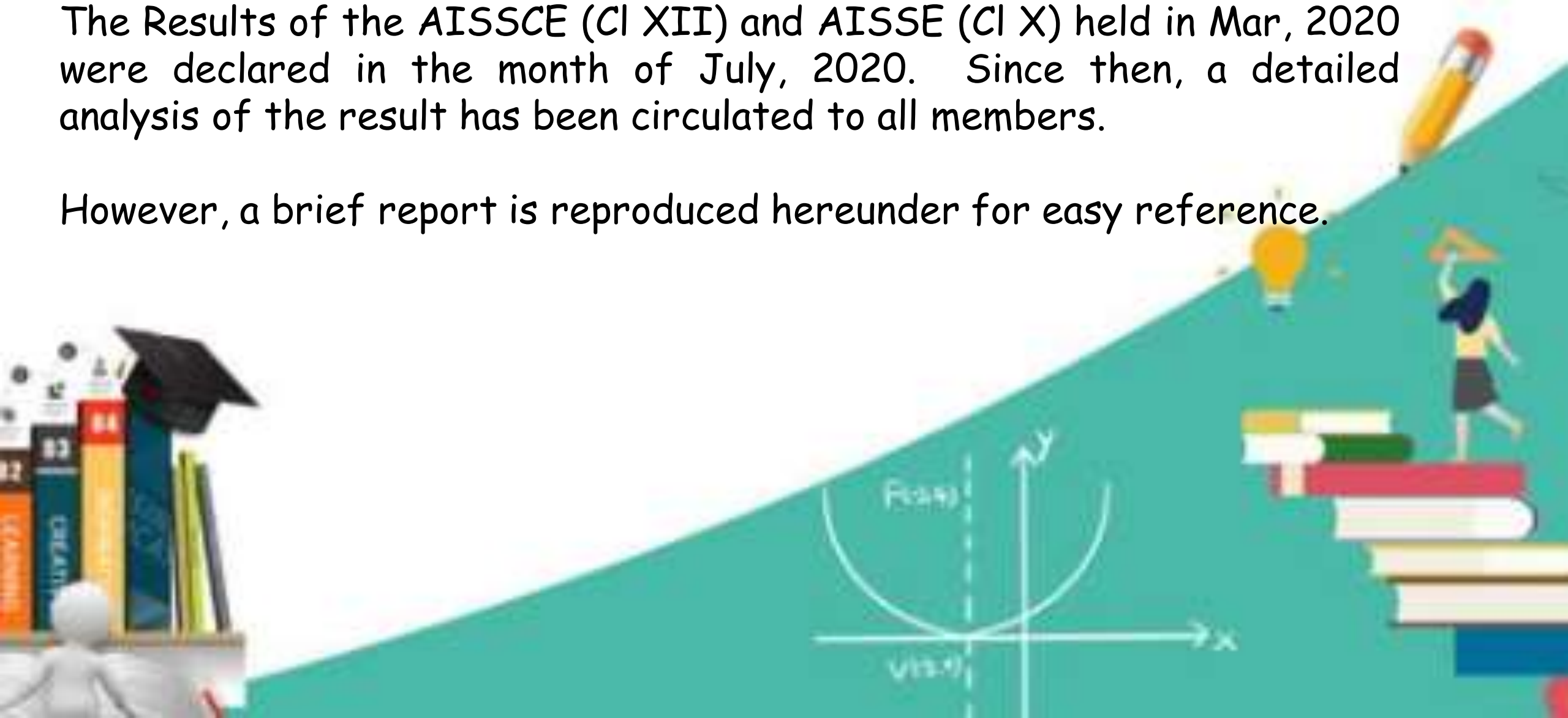

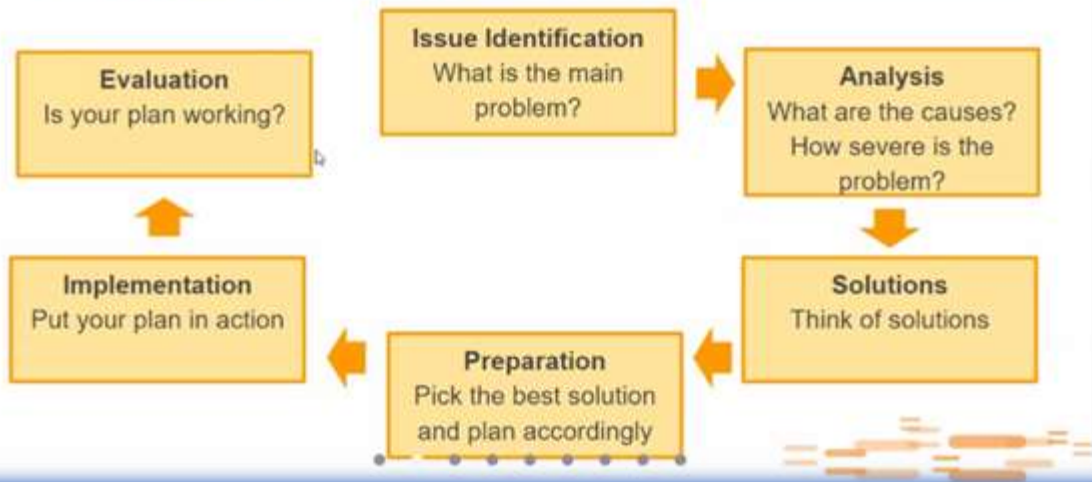


OTHER ACADEMIC INITIATIVES

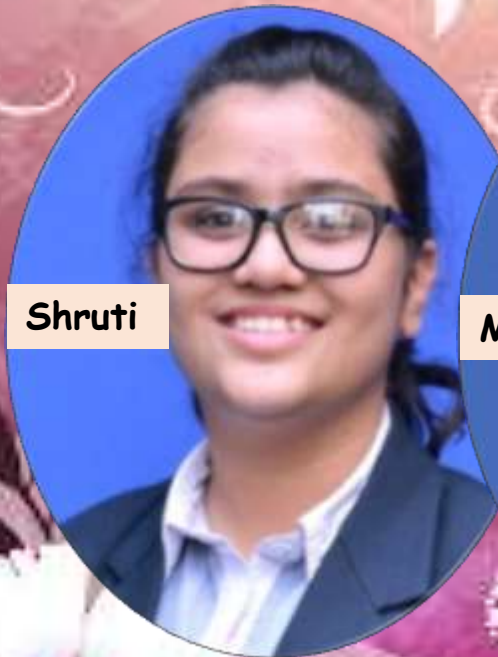


'Go Laadli' is a social impact organization with the mission of empowering young women of India to become problem solvers, leaders and changemakers.

Safety and Security

While there is no clarity on when the schools will re-open, the school has worked on a post-lockdown plan which involves a number of social distancing measures. The safety and security of the school building has further been strengthened by planning security gates all across the school building and placing of grills in the corridor of 2nd and 3rd floor.

Also the school is awaiting the Govt. guidelines on post-lockdown plan for schools.

The detailed SOP guidelines with directions for our stakeholders, teachers, parents and students will be released on school website, a week in advance before the re-opening of the school.

School Transport

The U P Govt. has issued orders stating that the schools across the state will not charge transport fee from the parents during lockdown period / till the school transport resumes.



Finance

The school has requested the 179 fee defaulting parents to pay the pending fee dues of the first quarter (April - June). At the same time, the school has provided plethora of payment options to these parents to pay the fee in an easy manner.

The financial health of the school is satisfactory to sustain for Quarter-2. Salaries of the school staff, (Regular and Retainers) have been disbursed for the month of May, June & July, 2020.

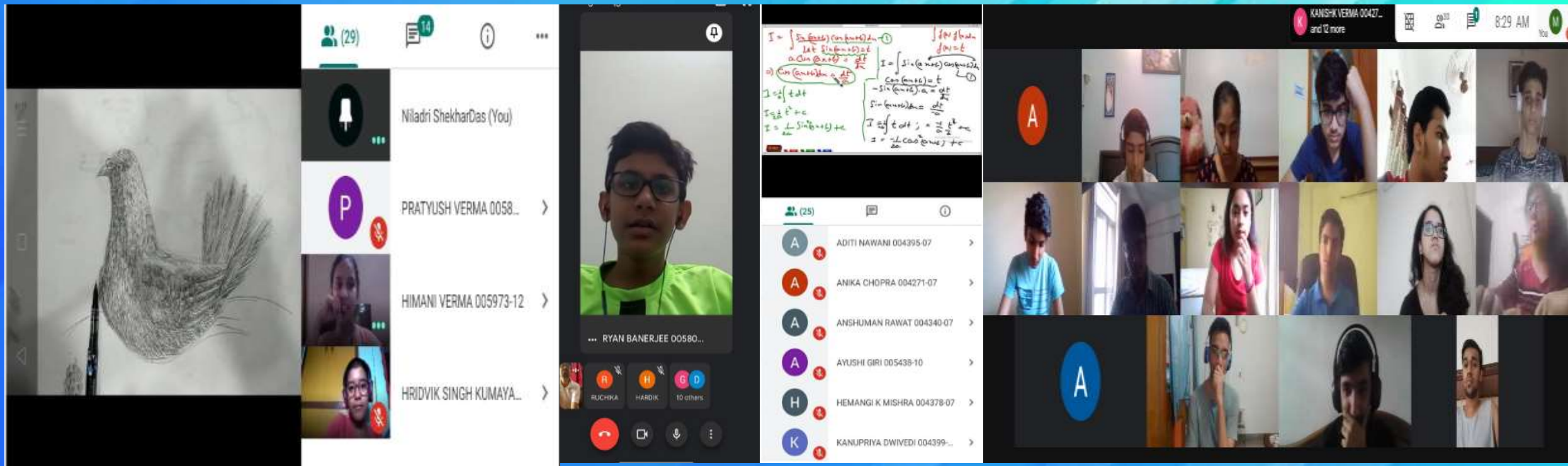


Meeting with Staff
