



## **Report on Educational Excursion to Agrasen ki Baoli** **PRIMARY DEPARTMENT**

An educational excursion was organized to the historical step well-Agrasen ki Baoli on 27<sup>th</sup> July 2019. 123 students of class III escorted by 9 teachers went to this famous monument. Agrasen ki Baoli is a protected monument by the ASI (Archaeological Survey of India) which is a 60m long and 15m wide historical step well on Hailey Road near Connaught Place, New Delhi. It is believed that it was originally built by the legendary king, Agrasen and rebuilt in the 14<sup>th</sup> century by the Agrawal community during the rule of Tuglaqs in Delhi.

This trip was undertaken as a part of the project-WATER. The aim of the visit was to show the importance of saving water. The entry to the Baoli was smooth. When the students entered the Baoli, they were mesmerized to see the huge well. When it came to climbing down to the well, it was awe inspiring as there were 108 steps with pigeons all around. The students noted down the important points in their notebooks and were asked to prepare for the online quiz which will be taken up by them after the trip.

Children enjoyed the trip and learnt about the historic way of conserving water. It was truly a day dipped in fun and excitement for the little ones.
