## 1. Content of the Workshop/Seminar

National Progressive School Conference organized a workshop on "Early Intervention For Academic Skills" at Mira Model School, Janakpuri, New Delhi on Friday August 30. 2019. The Aim of the workshop was to make teachers aware about early intervention needs, enhancing the techniques of their teachings and find the ways to make early intervention for class 1.

The workshop started with making teaches read meaningless syllables and giving them idea about how difficult it is for a child to understand the new language. Ms. Geetika, the Convener for the workshop emphasized on the following 3 aspects:

a)Emotional readiness, b) Social readiness, c) Academic readiness of a child before entering to the school environment.

### **Emotional Readiness includes**

- If a child is feeling safe in spite of family absence
- Endless wait for owns feeling
- Thoughts to be addressed of every child
- Toilet training

- Can keep himself/herself self-motivated even with no so preferred tasks
- Able to share space with others



#### **Social Readiness includes**

- Teacher's acceptance
- Observation and learning
- Can learn without frequent direct telling
- Able to follow up instructions

#### Academic Readiness includes

- Adequate gross motor skills
- Able to listen a lesson for about at least 20 minutes Without losing interest
- Vocabulary of nouns
- Adjectives and actions

Then she discussed about assumption of school education models which includes if a child is not able to catch a concept in school then he/she will catch up it at home and teachers should focus on syllabus and give them time to catch a concept.



Beyond regular education she talked about the reality of Inclusive Education as 1% of school population needs different setting, 2-4% needs intensive individual intervention, 15-18% needs specialized intervention and accommodation, 40 % of the school need the extra attention and 50% will acquire skills through immersion or additional tutoring at home. She emphasized on precision teaching which includes setting of the environment and classroom, past association of the knowledge, learning targets – what to teach, learning procedures –how to teach and designing instructions. Then workshop came to an end by explaining the increasing referrals in Grade 7 and 10 as most of the children don't get the early intervention in grade 1.
