### Assessment Challenges

In order to assess the learning outcomes, regular assessments were taken through Google classroom. Informal English Assessment (listening and recitation), was conducted on 20<sup>th</sup> May - 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2020. Poems recorded by teachers were shared with the students. Stories based on Panchatantra were narrated in the classroom and a question-answer session based on the story was conducted to evaluate their ability to listen and comprehend effectively. Spell Check was conducted on 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 to evaluate their spelling retention. An MCQ based, Formal English Assessment for round I was held for all classes on 6<sup>th</sup> June and 13<sup>th</sup> June 2020 through Google Forms.

# Academics: Our Core Strength

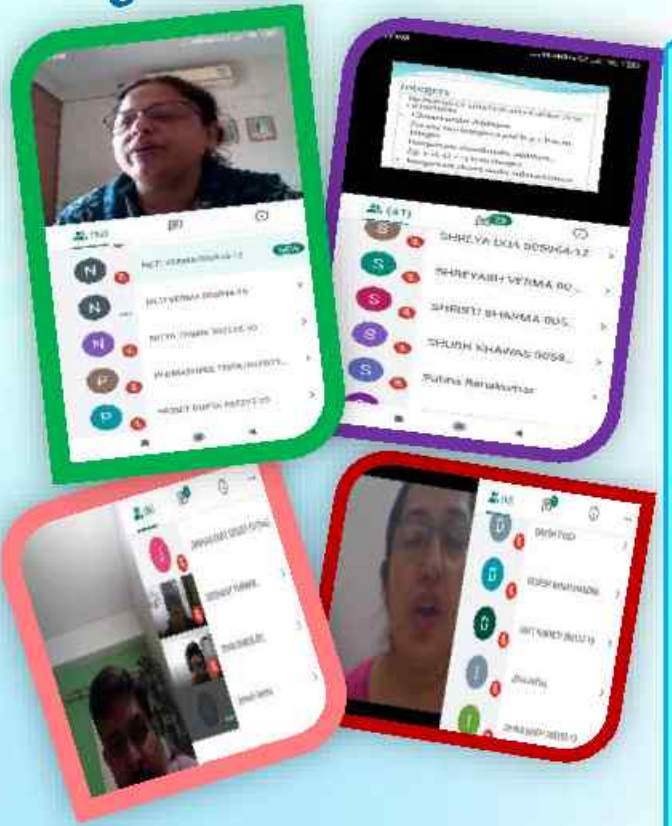
Amalgamating Scholastic Knowledge with Social Skills.....

## Middle & Secondary Section

**Orientation day** for the new academic session was conducted by the deputed Class Teachers.

**Online classes** commenced from 23<sup>rd</sup> March for class X, from 1<sup>st</sup> April for class IX and from 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2020 for classes VI to VIII. Subject specific videos, study material and assignments were shared and evaluated every week. Various **learning and interactive tools** such as Jam board, Screen sharing, PPTs and Audios were used to enhance learning outcome.

Apart from Academics, Sessions dealing with Physical fitness, Performing Arts, Counselling, Reading through Kaizala App & Awakened Citizenship Activities along with other co-curricular activities like Painting, Weekly Quiz competitions, Webinars on Adobe Spark and Ways to Create Apps were held for the young learners. Under Project Covid, assignments and videos and language enhancement activities were conducted on a regular basis along with maintaining the Daily Attendance and Weekly Planners by the teachers.

## Assessment time...

Round 1 Assessment of all the subjects for classes VI to X were conducted from 1st to 13th June, 2020 using Google Form Quiz/Assessments. The response submission was scheduled for 45 Minutes for classes VI-VIII and one hour for IX & X, total weightage being 25 marks. Doubt clarifying sessions duly followed by Mock tests held before the Round Test were highly appreciated by all the parents.



**CFSI Activities-** To motivate and encourage the students with special need registered with CFI, individual sessions and personalised attention have been given by the special educators on a regular basis with required intervention by the School counsellor.

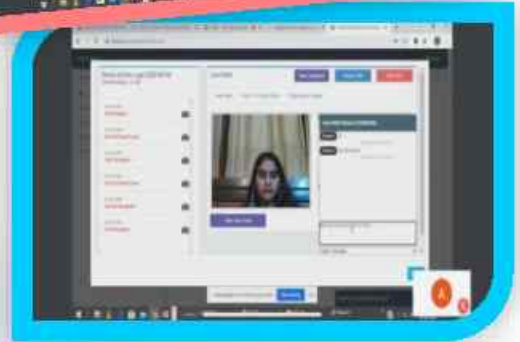

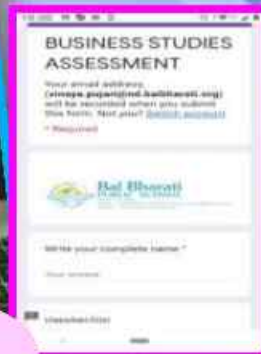
## Building Leaders for life...

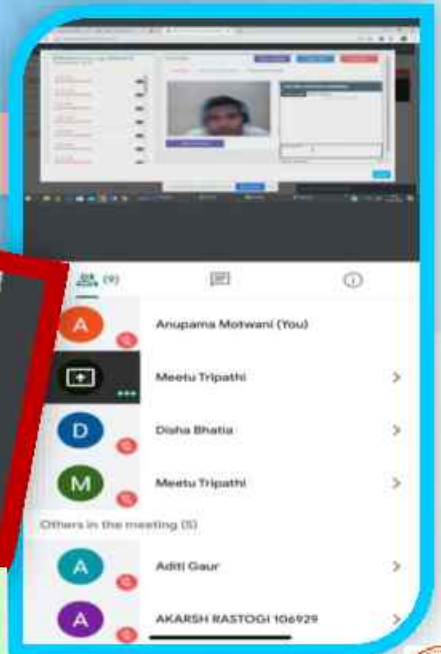
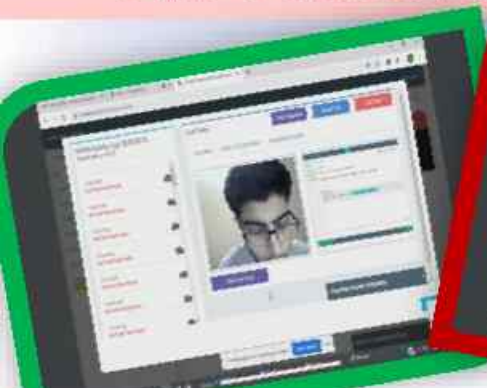
### Gauging Knowledge Through Formal Assessment

**Physical fitness is not just crucial for a healthy body, a healthy mind but is imperative for the holistic well-being of a person.**

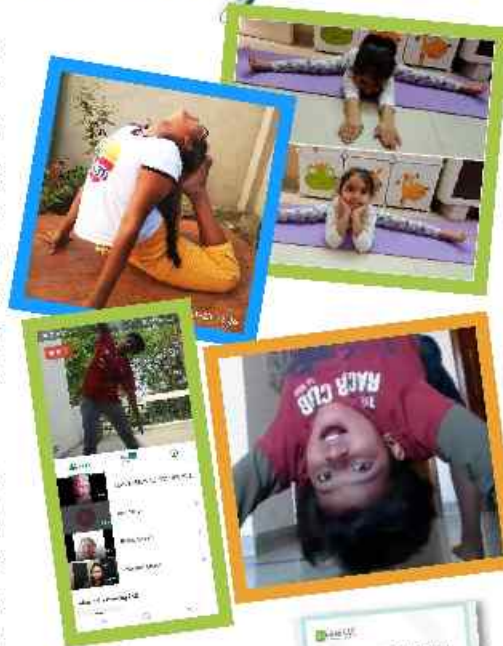
