
4. WITH UNITED ARAB EMIRATES

5. WITH RUSSIA




TOPIC: AN EDUCATIONAL EXCHANGE (INTERACTION)

When educators work together, they create a better learning experience. An interactive educational






6. WITH PAKISTAN

HAPPY HOME SCHOOL, KARACHI, PAKISTAN


TOPIC: <u>LINGUISTIC AND EDUCATIONAL</u> EXCHANGE THROUGH STORIES


The international collaboration between Pakistan and India was driven by the International Association of School Libraries USA tocreate an environment of
