





The total enrolment as on date (17 February, 2022), is 2744 students with 1399 boys and 1345 girls.





 The Third Round (Offline exam) for Class XII commenced on 17 Jan, 2022 and is underway.



Online PTMs were held as scheduled by the school.





REMEDIAL CLASSES


Remedial classes aim at identifying the learning gaps of the students, to provide required personal assistance. Teachers are conducting remedial and support classes for the students to close the gap between what students know and what they're expected to know in each grade.

The number of the students in the remedial classes has reduced considerably after Term I. Classes are taken in small groups providing the students personal attention by using innovative support material.





 Experiment-based learning, Creation of a Class Digital Scrapbook in order to inculcate a sense of exploration in the learners, Quizziz, Live worksheets, Spin the wheel, Storyweaver, Puppetry, Extramarks modules, Fact sharing sessions, Science songs have been made a part of Online Teaching Learning process.




- Bhasha Sangam Integrated approach towards various languages and cultures has been well adopted by the school.

Students have started creating books using storyweaver and book creator Apps. They have also learnt to create their own newspaper using Boomwriter, Nearpod and Pixton applications. Padlet has been used for collaborative discussion and View sharing in the classroom.

- 21 staff members have developed the audio and video content to participate in AICEF (All India Children's Educational Audio-Video Festivals.) organized by CBSE.











 Use of audio books developed by NCERT are also incorporated to aid the learning of these students.






 IEP for Term-II indicating the academic goals were prepared and mailed to the parents. Fortnightly reports indicating the progress of each child are sent on a regular basis.







Congratulations to Laurieus on successfully completing Cryptology: Math and Codes! Levanya's overall score in the course was determined as a weighted average of discussion (75%), chapter homework (98%), unit exams (92%), and the Final Assessment (82%).

Throughout her enrighment, Lavanya was a strong, proactive student who persistent through challenging concepts. She demonstrated her understanding of the course content through her scores on the various assignments, in her discussion posts, Lavanya often provided thoughtful, comprehensive answers strat clearly showed her knowledge of crystology. She was also very consistent on both chapter homework assignments and sinit exams. Lavanya was proficient in all twenty chapters completed and sin of the seven units completed. I would suggest she review Affine ciphers to fully master the course content.

Lavarrya took advantage of many opportunities to deepen her unidentialising of the course material throughout her entralment. When she needed clanification or extra practice with a specific topic, she took the initiative to reach out to her instructor to schedule a review session. Lavarrya always came prepared with questions and actively worked through practice problems until she unidentiood the concept. She also completed overall optional challenge assignments. At the end of each unit, Lavarrya was given the option to decrypt a scavenger hunt message using the encryption method covered at that unit. The decryption of these messages were more challenging than those presented in the unit. Lavarrya successfully decrypted four rossages, showing her deep understanding of the ciphers she studies. She was clearly very engaged with the course material, and this altimately but to her great success. I encourage Lavarrya to continue challenging herself to delive deeper into the mathematics she learned in Cryptology.










OPEN EXAMS







HEALTH AND WELLNESS CLUB








VEER GATHA PROJECT: 21 OCTOBER 2021- 20 NOVEMBER 2021



CBSE HERITAGE INDIA QUIZ (28.01.2022 TO 28.02.2022)




GRAPHIC NOVELS

The Graphic Novels are nearing completion and the school is in the process of applying for the QR Codes with CBSE.




ANY OTHER INTRODUCTION OF CODING AS A SKILL SUBJECT



All Labs of the school are functional and are being prepared for the forthcoming CBSE Practical examination.








Upgradation in Technology



DIGITIZATION








CBSE CAREER GUIDANCE PORTAL






BOOK MARK EXCHANGE PROGRAMME
