


## **ACCOLADES**



The CBSE (Class-XII) Term-II Practical Examination commenced on 03 Mar, 2022 and concluded on 05 April, 2022.






- Online and offline Special Education Sessions were conducted by the Special Educators for the holistic development of children.




# CONGRATULATIONS






### **GANGA QUEST**
