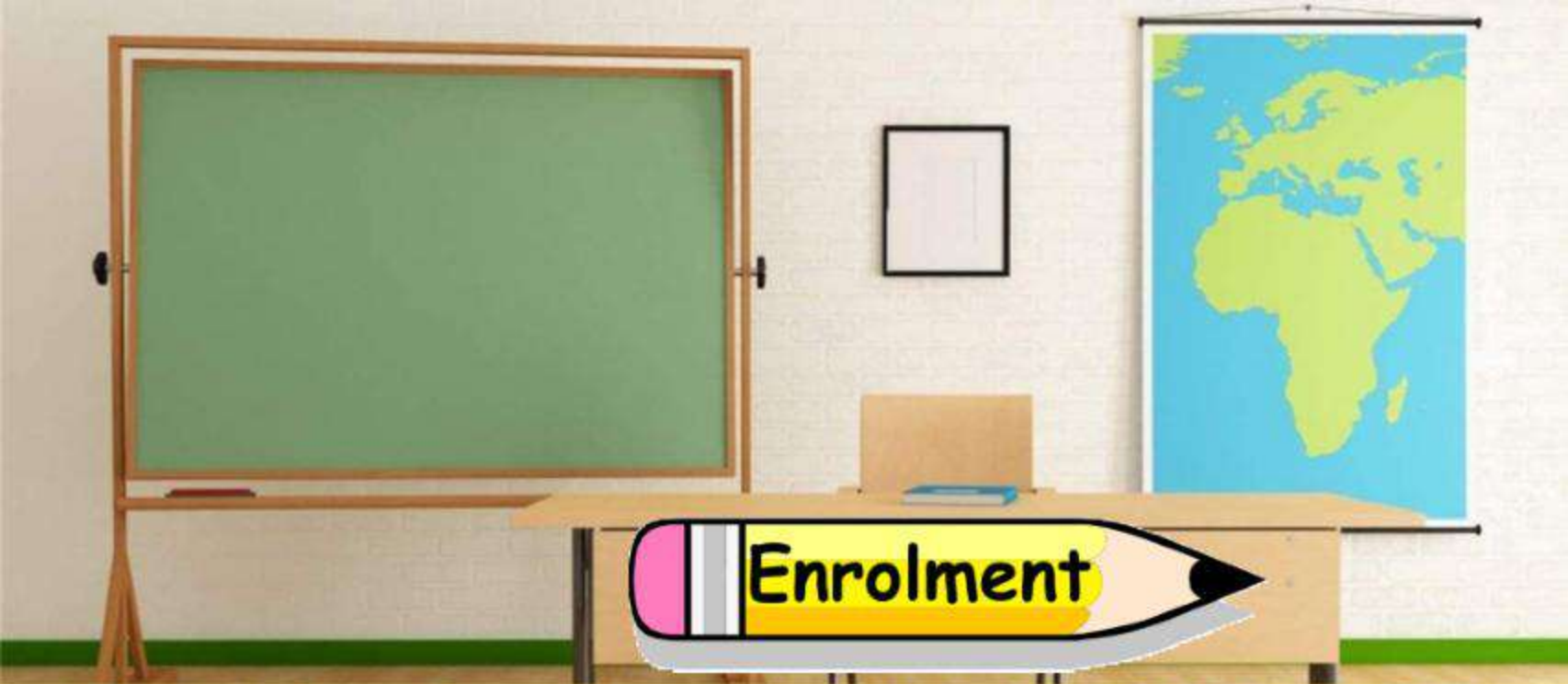

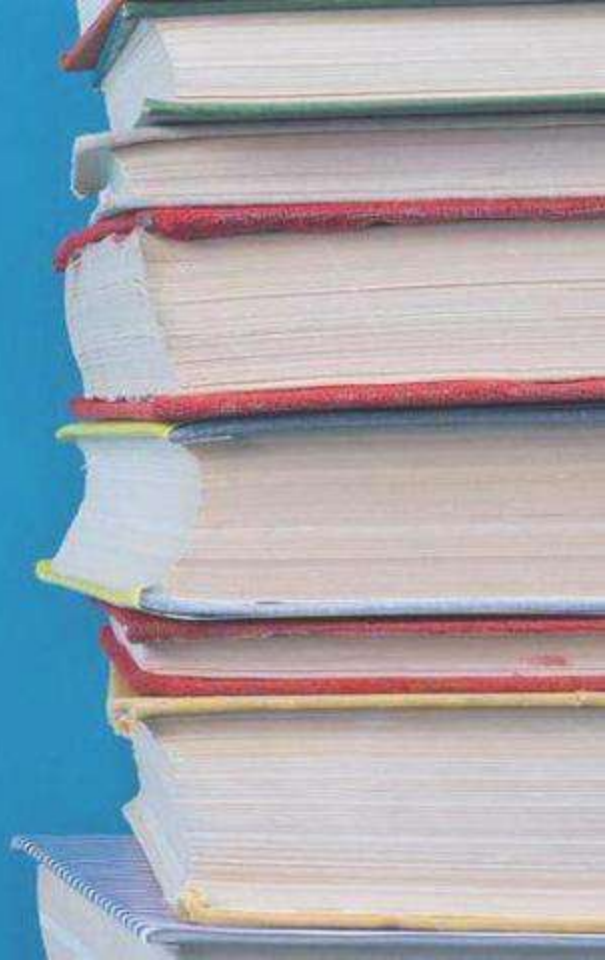
CBSE Examination

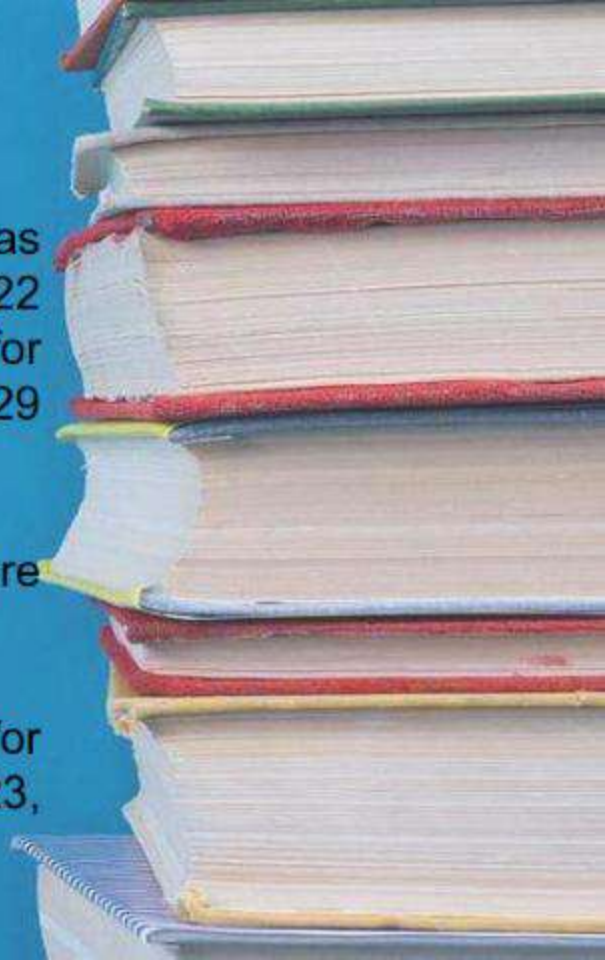
Classes I – V

- The Annual Examination for Class V concluded on 16 March, 2022.



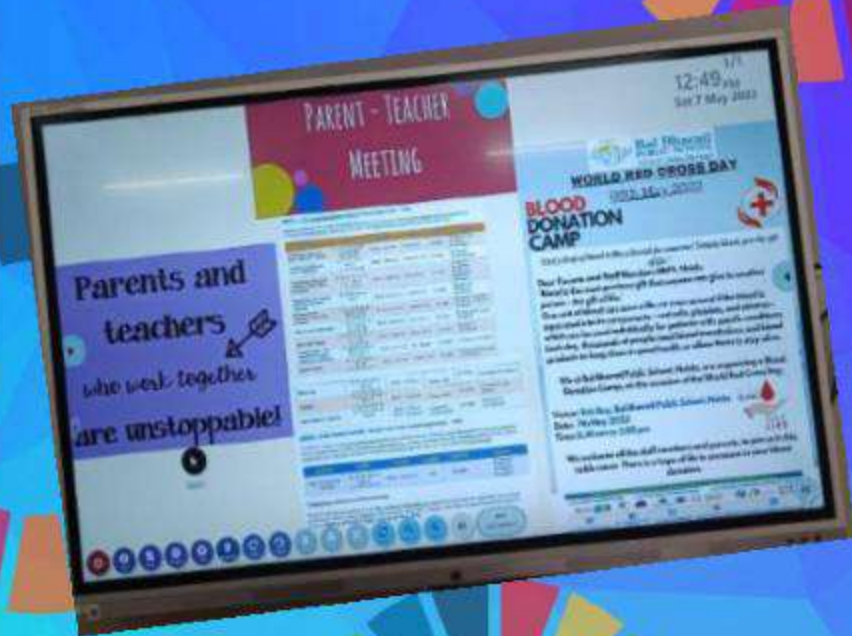
Classes VI – XII

- Round-1 Examination / Pre Term Examination for VI to X and XII for the session 2022-23, commenced on 02 May, 2022.



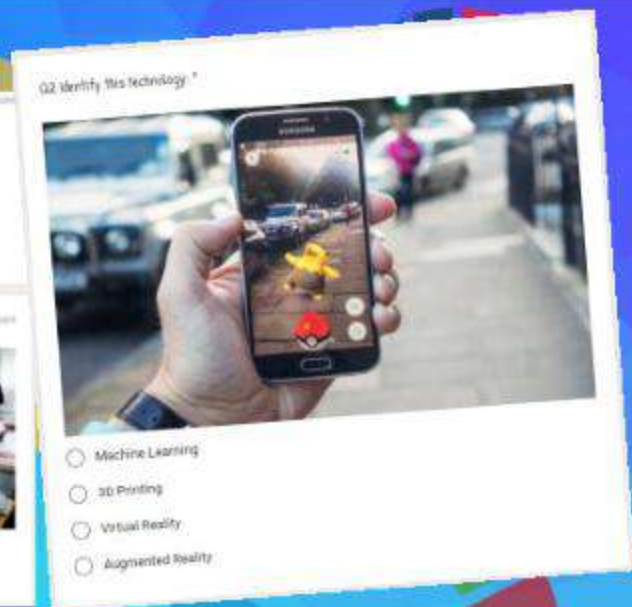
PTMs



Special efforts are being taken to integrate the students enrolled with learning disabilities.



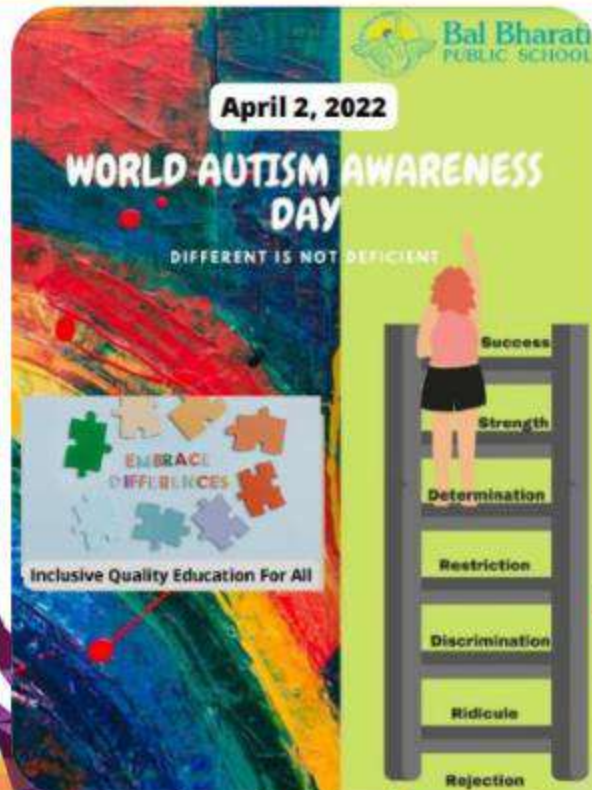
ACADEMICS

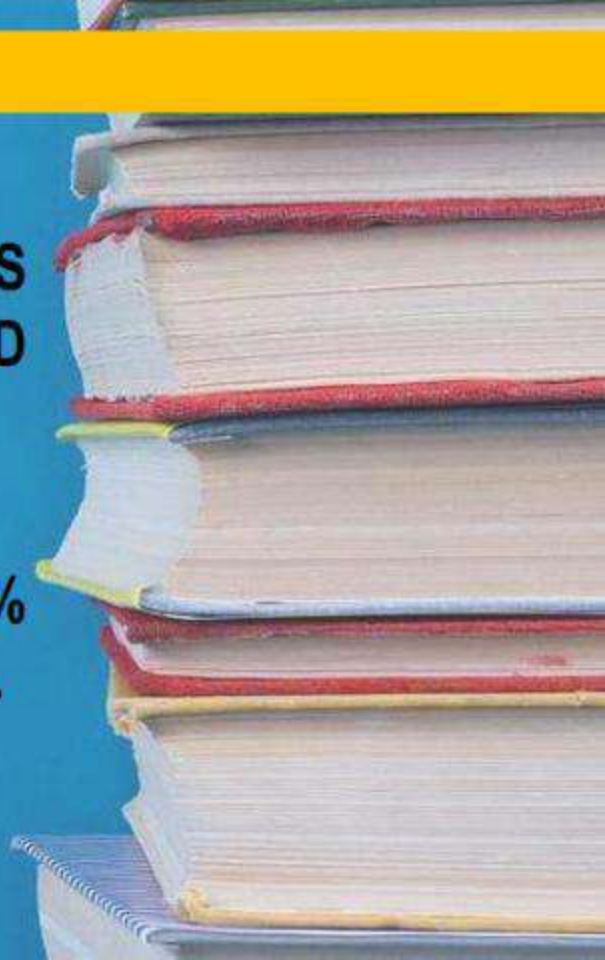

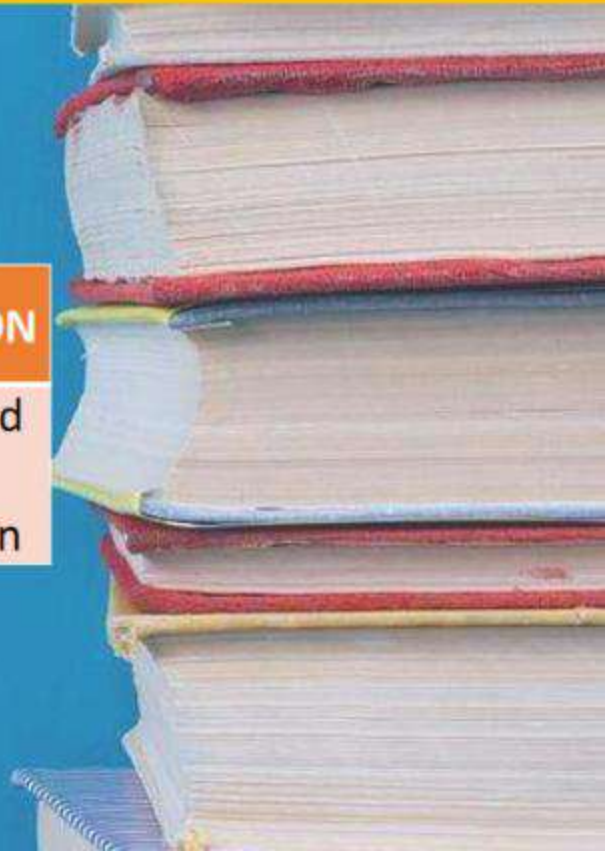

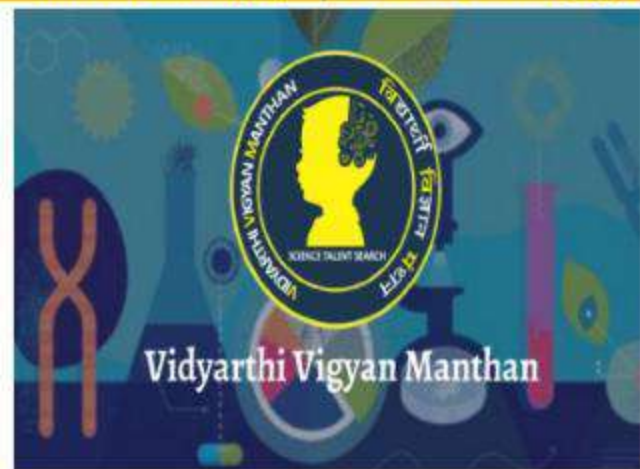

That's why AIM has taken all across the country to find talents from all the nooks and corners of the nation. - Entire staff of the school is fully vaccinated as on date.



Underlined by the plight of most migrant labourers around India, but especially in the north, as the result of these efforts a large part was absorbed by the Ministry of Labour and Employment under the Government of India to form a database of workers in the unorganised sector. The objective of the initiative is to provide social and labour security to the less privileged. An 8-Steps has been promulgated, as a check list will be issued to workers who successfully register on the portal.

Remarkable Movements from the Past

- Workers' Memorial Day, also known as International Workers' Memorial Day, takes place annually around the world on April 28, an international day of remembrance and action for workers killed, disabled, injured, or made worse by their work. The International Labour Organization, in raising awareness on the adoption of such practices in workplaces and the role that occupational safety and health workers play.
- On 14 April 2022, The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) made history by successfully launching its satellites from its launch vehicle PSLV-C57. PSLV-C57 carried into the space together all its satellites into the intended orbit within minutes of each other in an important milestone for the country's space programme. The mission was perfect and for the first time, ten satellites were launched within one mission.

Some dignitaries born on this day (Past - Present)

- Bhanu Athaiya, born on 18 April 1932, was an Indian costume designer. She worked in over 100 films, with Indian filmmakers such as Guru Dutt, Yash Chopra, B.R. Chopra, Raj Kapoor, and international directors such Carol Reed and Richard Attenborough. She was the first Indian to win an Academy Award, winning one for costume design for Gandhi in 1982.
- Ferruccio Lamborghini, born on 18 April 1916, was an Italian industrialist. In 1963, he created Automobili Lamborghini, a maker of high-end sports cars in Sant'Agata Bolognese, Italian industrialist who founded a luxury car company that produced some of the fastest, most expensive and sought-after sports cars in the world. Lamborghini worked in a machine in the Italian army during World War II, and after the war started a tractor company.
- Idella Harper Lewis, born on April 28, 1901, was an American novelist best known for her 1940 novel To Kill a Mockingbird. It was the 1960 Pulitzer Prize and has become a classic of modern American literature. She published only two books, yet she was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1993 for her contribution to literature.


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MEETING WITH STAFF
