A word of gratitude for our ever supportive parents, who kept pace with the school and became foster teachers at home to ensure continuity of education.

During the course of each academic year, we come across a lot of opportunities, challenges and sometimes setbacks, but overcoming obstacles brings genuine joy and gratification as we move a step closer towards our goals. We at Bal Bharati, Noida look forward to stepping into the new academic session with our eyes set at the zenith of success and glory.

In the ongoing story of success, we proudly bring forth the new areas that the school ventured in and the Achievements of our students during the academic session 2021-22.

<u>Skill Education</u>: Your skills determine your ability to execute your dreams. The school firmly believes in empowering the students by developing their talents and thereby creating a future ready generation.

Artificial intelligence (AI) is being widely recognized as the power that will fuel the global digital economy in the near future. To keep our students abreast with the changing technologies, the school introduced Artificial Intelligence, as one of the skill subjects. The first batch of students studying AI at Sr Secondary level will appear for their Board Examination in the year 2022. Seeing the enthusiasm of parents and students, the school plans to introduce **Coding** for students of Classes VI -VIII and later on supplement this course with **Augmented Reality and Virtual Reality courses** The aim is to make our students future ready and improve their learning experiences.

For those who are not technically inclined, school proposes to introduce two new courses - FMM and Tourism at +2 level and Handicrafts at Middle and Secondary level.

AISSE & AISSCE-2021 Results. The flagship of the school fluttered high with a stupendous result, at the AISSCE as well as AISSE. The school averages of 91.28% (Class XII) and 89.8% (Class X) were the highest amongst the top rated schools of India.

The school boasts of 82 perfect scorers in various subjects for Class X and 10 perfect scorers for Class XII.

Harshit Kansal (X) achieved academic excellence with a whopping 99.8% and the feat of achievement was further enhanced by Yash Garg (XII) who scored an aggregate of 99.2%.

Also, in case of a long sickness of more than 2-3 days, the school needs to be informed through an e-mail / letter, addressed to the School Principal, with regard to the nature of illness and the number of days the student is likely to be away from school. Keeping COVID 19 protocols in mind and ensuring safety and well-being of all our students, parents are requested that students suffering from cold, cough, fever or any other contagious diseases should not be sent to school, till the mandatory period of quarantine is over

For any assistance / clarification related to School Transport, kindly contact the Transport I/C, Mr Anoop Dixit. Please note, bus routes cannot be altered to suit individual conveniences. **Bus fee will be payable for 11 months.**

Parents / Guardians of students using school transport, desirous of taking their child / ward in the personal vehicles under **exceptional circumstances**, may do so with the express permission of the concerned **Headmistress/ VPL / PPL in writing**. This has been necessitated keeping in mind the prevailing law and order situation and safety of the students.

VAN USERS GUIDELINES

In our constant endeavor to ensure safety of our students, we reiterate that only safe and legal means of transportation for your children must be used. Preferably, use school buses only as they are safer and secure in comparison to the Private vans/Cabs and other means of transportation.

In case you opt for private vans/Cabs for your ward's transportation then you are requested to ensure compliance to the guidelines of Supreme Court and Directorate of Education issued from time to time regarding safe and secure transportation of children including following:

- Ensure the cab/taxi/van is registered with the Transport Department under the school Cab Scheme of the Private Motor Registration Act.
- To ensure safety of children, the vehicle registered under the scheme should be equipped with the safety features including speed Governors, GPRS Devices, Fire Extinguishers and First Aid Box.
- Ensure that there is a lady attendant in the van in the morning as well as in the afternoon.
- Keep regular check that driver is not driving negligently or indulging in rash driving.
- Ensure that driver adheres to the school timings.
- Ensure that van/cab is not overloaded.
- Ensure Yellow Strip mentioning "SCHOOL CAB" is there on the vehicle.
- Ensure Vehicle is fit as per Govt. norms like fitness, insurance etc.
- Ensure driver is in proper Uniform.
- Ensure CNG fitness certificate for vans/cabs.
- In case of any change in the duty of driver or vehicle the same must be informed to the school at the earliest.

• Please provide vehicle registration number, License details, identity card and the latest police verification report of the driver/conductor/helper to the school through class teacher.

As the school has no control over van/cab drivers therefore you are required to be more vigilant while engaging them for transportation of your children. In case you wish to switch to school bus, you may submit an application to the school and school will make best effort to accommodate your request as per the Rules and feasibility.

No security and safety of students is complete without the active participation and support of the parents; we seek your cooperation in providing a safe environment to children.

Safety of our children is the collective responsibility of parents and school administration.

LIFE SKILL/VALUE EDUCATION

- From our experience and various case-studies, we have come to a conclusion, **the family background and value system** play a very crucial role in the emotional and psychological well being of a child. Hence, the role of a parent is once again being reinforced and it is suggested that both the parents (Mother and Father) attend the **Parent Teacher Meetings** scheduled in the diary.
- In order to inculcate the right moral values in the students, the school has adopted the **Awakened Citizen Programme** for Cls VI to VIII which is another step towards inculcating the right values.
- School has introduced various **Skill Development Programmes** i.e. Aeromodelling, Robotics, Theatre and Astronomy in the school curriculum for **Classes VI VIII**. Though this programme has additional skills, yet it is optional. Being a part of NEP, 2020, I request the students to join the Skill Development Programme, necessary for holistic education and to hone additional skills.

REDUCTION IN WEIGHT OF THE SCHOOL BAG

The primary and the middle school staff has been instructing students to restrict the number of text books and note books being brought to the school on a daily basis so as to reduce the load of the school bag thereby making 'Learning without Burden'. Despite repeated reminders, it has been observed a good number of students carry excessive load other than the one prescribed in the School Time Table. The school would like to reiterate in unequivocal terms that not adhering to the Time Table for the day and carrying a load is detrimental to the health of the students. In view of the above, parents are requested to adhere to the following weight of the School Bag as mentioned below:

PHYSICAL FITNESS REGIME

Physical Fitness Protocol

Regular exercise and physical activity improves respiratory cardio vascular health and overall wellbeing of an individual. We all have realized that post pandemic some of our children have become obese and lethargic. Staying active can help maintain a healthy weight and reduce the probability of developing serious ailments.

The school is also a part of FIT INDIA MOVEMENT with a view to making fitness an integral part of our daily lives. Keeping the above in mind, the school has initiated the **Physical Fitness Protocols** for Age Group of 5-18 years to assess the overall fitness of Classes I to XII, outdoor activities like Plate Tapping, Sit ups, Flamingo Balancing Test are being conducted and for Classes IV - XI, 600 m brisk walking, Push up test, Partial Curl up activities are taken up.

VISIT TO SOLAN ACTIVITY CENTRE

In order to incorporate an element of fun and adventure in learning, **Child Education Society (Regd.)**, the parent body of our school, has set up an **Experiential Learning Centre at Solan**, **Himachal** This centre promotes learning through active and engaging exercises, it goes a long way in making the students self-reliant and confident and therefore, **mandates participation**

of all the students. Parents are to note that, students will be graded for the activities performed by them at Solan. The schedule for Solan Trips (2022-23) will shortly be available on the school website.

SAFETY PERSPECTIVE

Creating safe schools involves more than the physical safety of students. BBPS (Noida) provides for safe environment to its students. The campus is under the surveillance of 202 CCTV cameras. The buses are also fitted with cameras for constant monitoring. In addition to the physical wellbeing of students nurturing of emotional environment is indispensable for fostering growth and development. The school believes in creating conducive learning environment and in this context conducts regular webinars on 'Good Touch Bad Touch', 'Health and Hygiene', 'Bullying' and POCSO. The sense of belonging and self-esteem that accrues from an appropriate emotional environment significantly contributes to the success and achievement of a child.

MOBILE PHONES

- The ubiquitous mobile phones have seeped into the lives of every individual, irrespective of whether they are students, teachers or others. The school is of the opinion that all stakeholders connected with school education need to arrive at a consensus on the use of mobile phones in the school and restricting its entry in the school campus.
- The parents of Middle / Secondary/Sr. Secondary school students are requested to ensure that their wards are convinced about not carrying mobile phones to the school, since they are a serious cause of distraction, lack of concentration, anxiety, fear and sometimes even misuse. We would request parents to help us in creating a meaningful learning atmosphere for a better ambience and school environment.
- Please note, the school will be only liable to return the SIM Card, once the parent / guardian have signed the Black Register for defying the school policy.
- There have been various instances of cyber bullying and misuse of mobile phones amongst the student community. The nature of such cases has been diverse and complex. Parents are requested to go through the Cyber Policy and Cyber Safety Guidelines available on the School website. Also, any undesirable aspect of a child, which is difficult for the parent to handle at home, the intervention of school Counselor is to be sought on an immediate basis.

Hence, all parents/guardians/visitors are expected to visit the school premises in an appropriate attire and **slippers**, **shorts**, **night dresses**, **track suit etc are to be avoided at all costs**, failing which the entry of such personnel will be denied and they will NOT be entertained to resolve the purpose of their visit.
- It is also observed that the parents / guardians request to see the various school authorities at any time convenient to them. It is strongly felt that, while this may be convenient to the parents / guardians, it is NOT so for the school authorities who are engaged in other activities. Therefore, the parents / guardians are advised to adhere to the laid down timings given in the School Almanac to meet the School Authorities as indicated against their designation.

• Similarly, the parents / guardians are advised to refrain from visiting the school for handing over to their wards the 'forgotten' tiffin box / books/or any other such items. Needless to say, besides disturbing the concerned ward from the school activities, it also causes additional strain on the meagre school resources to hand over such articles to the concerned child.

BEST PRACTICES

• To conserve natural resources and set up a healthy precedent, all circulars, announcements, photographs etc are uploaded for the information of the parents on the website. The school website is updated on a regular basis. Kindly visit the School Website at least thrice a week. Parents can also contact the Principal through the school e-mail ids duly given on the cover page of the school almanac.
