Dear Stakeholders,

Our cities are littered with non-biodegradable plastic material, and it is greatly adding to environmental stress and degradation. The way ahead is to ensure that ubiquitous plastic items in our daily lives are recycled or disposed off safely. Microplastics are evidently everywhere now and their influence is affecting not just people's lives but also the environment. More than 40 percent of all plastics are made into single-use products in India. The impact and implications of microplastics on the health of the planet and its inhabitants are insurmountable. Our landfills are exploding and our dumpsites are burning more than ever and our waterways are more choked with plastic pollution. These airborne plastics not only have the capacity to cross-continental borders but can also reach our bloodstream.





In a move that could have a significant impact on checking plastic pollution, India banned the use of 'single-use plastic' from July 1, 2022. The Ministry for Environment, Forest and Climate Change issued the notification last year in August announcing a ban on single-use plastic effective from July, 2022. The assigned banned items are:
