- 6) "COVID-19 preparedness and response" (newly added in view of the COVID pandemic).









- Round-1 / Pre Term Examination for Classes VI to X commenced on 02 May, 2022 and concluded on 18 July, 2022.

ACADEMICS

- Special Educators helped ensure the mental and physical health of all students and their families.






OFFLINE GUIDANCE & COUNSELING SESSIONS

- 8 Guidance and Counseling sessions were conducted by School Counselor, Dr. Swati Sharma from 1 July to 16 August, 2022.
- This period also focused on preliminary screening for the recommended counseling cases, through naturalistic observations, academic, and functional assessments.
- During this period, the department was able to formulate the SOP's with regard to the working of the department, developing a standardized approach across school for referral of cases, and mechanisms for going ahead with the identified cases for academic and psychological well-being of students across school.
- The process of preliminary screening was followed by the development of a referral form for academic, and guidance counseling for teachers.

Radhika Singh (XII) Change Makers Bootcamp was held at IIT Delhi campus for 30 shortlisted high schoolers from 23 May to 24 June to train them with rapid prototyping skills, digital fabrication techniques and electro-mechanical engineering.

Two students of our school, Kushagra Pant (X) and Samriddhi Bisht (XII) were selected to attend the camp where they learnt skills like soldering, welding, 3D printing, laser cutting, drilling, etc and also visited labs at IIT Delhi. 




Korean Language Hobby Class
