Fame, Fortune, Freedom, Fullness.*

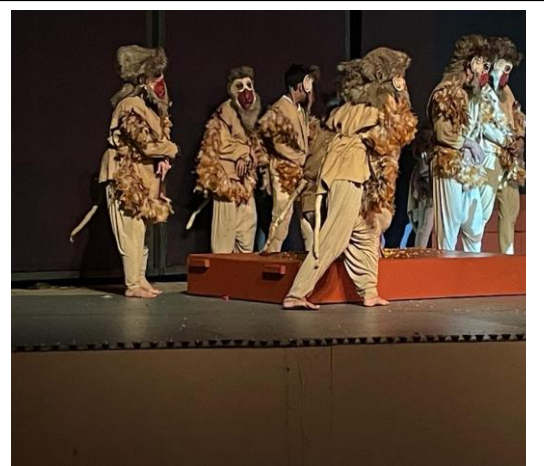
