The child will create a flip book on any one water animal mentioned above. The parent may help the child in creating the book. It can be created with A4 size sheet cut into half and can be filed together using a ribbon. The book will comprise of pictures and short, simple sentences. The flip book may have 3 to 5 pages only.

The child will then speak three to four lines on any one of the animals chosen by him/ her.

Create an underwater craft using used bottle caps and plastic wrappers on old newspapers on A4 sized coloured pastel sheet.




□ Let's gear up to play a game of Ocean Life
















SEAHORSE
