The Project Cheetah involves the translocation of Cheetahs from South Africa and Namibia to Kuno National Park in Madhya Pradesh. The tragic loss of nine Cheetahs from Namibia has starkly illustrated the need for ethical and responsible wildlife management. In order to raise awareness about the wildlife conservation among the students, the school organised number of activities for Classes I to XII. A presentation related to Project Cheetah was screened to students from Classes I to X which helped them to understand the need of the hour to conserve nature. The following events were planned to encourage ethical animal conservation and steps.
