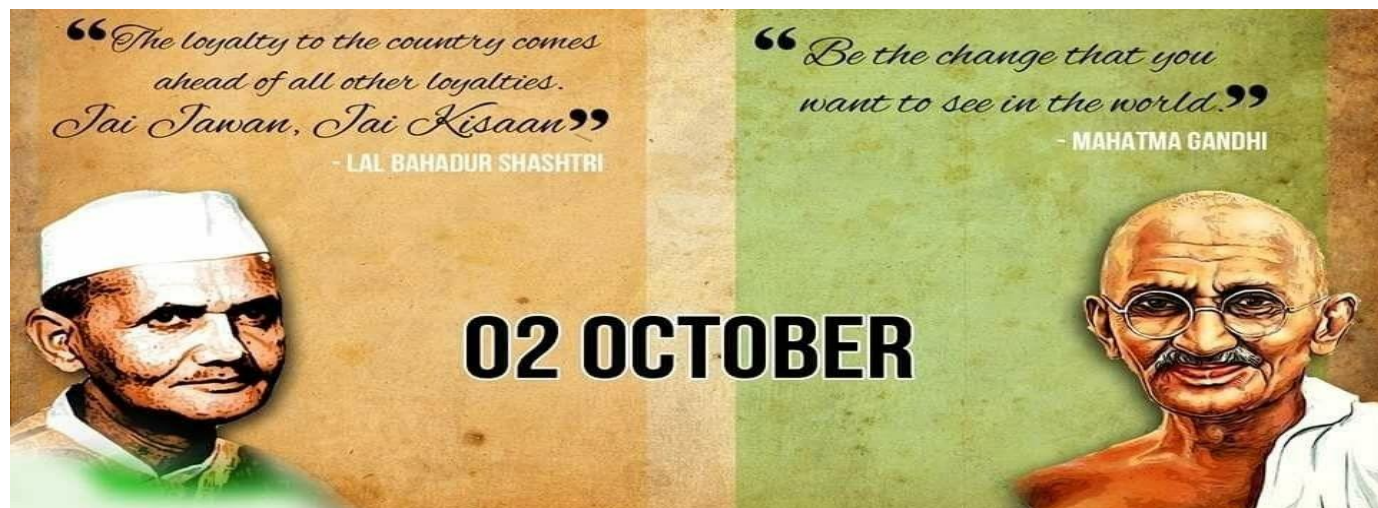




## **GANDHI JAYANTI/LAL BAHADUR SHASTRI JAYANTI CELEBRATIONS**
