The event was divided into two rounds, each focusing on different aspects of literature. The activity was organized with the purpose of promoting the works of renowned authors such as R K Narayan, Roald Dahl, Sudha Murthy, Ruskin Bond, Rudyard Kipling, and Panchatantra and celebrating Reading Week.

**Round 1: Scene Drawing and Book Identification**

In the first round, students were required to draw a scene from their favorite storybook written by one of the aforementioned authors. The aim of this round was to test their creativity, artistic skills, and knowledge of the chosen author's work. Once the scene was drawn, the students presented it to the class and quizzed their peers to guess the name of the book it was based on.
