"Preparation through education is less costly than learning through tragedy".


On October 11, 2023, an educational activity was organized for class V to raise awareness about "Disasters and Disaster Management." This activity was designed to engage students in learning about different aspects of disasters and how they are managed. The event consisted of two rounds and aimed to enhance students' knowledge, public speaking skills, and their understanding of disaster-related topics.

Round 1: Anchor Chart Presentation

In the first round, students were tasked with creating an anchor chart on any one subheading related to the theme "Disasters and Disaster Management." The subheadings included topics such as "Kinds of Disasters" (e.g., Australian Bushfire) and "Ways of Management" (e.g., Recovery, Mitigation). Each student had to prepare a visually appealing anchor chart and then speak about it for a duration of 1.30 to 2.00 minutes. The top three students from each section were identified, and their names were recorded for final round.



Round 2: Disaster and Disaster Management Quiz



The second and final round consisted of a quiz based on the theme "Disasters and Disaster Management." This round aimed to test the students' understanding of the subject and their ability to apply the knowledge they had gained from the first round. A quiz format was chosen to make the learning process interactive and engaging. The best three entries from both rounds were recognized and awarded the title of "Mr./Ms. Aware." This recognition celebrated their commitment to learning and their ability to communicate effectively and engage with the theme of disasters and disaster management.

The "Awareness on Disasters and Disaster Management" activity was a success in enhancing students' awareness of the subject. It provided them with an opportunity to explore topics related to disasters and disaster management, improve their public speaking skills, and engage in a quiz to test their understanding. The decision of the judges was considered final and binding, ensuring a fair and impartial evaluation of the participants. This initiative not only raised awareness about disasters but also encouraged students to be better informed about this critical topic, which is essential for their own safety and the well-being of their communities.
