There were 81 students who took up internships with NGOs such as Muskurahat Foundation, an NPO working towards the upliftment of the children of the financially

weaker sections of the society; Fortis Healthcare; Coca Cola; Younity Pvt Ltd, SPLAT MEDIA PVT LTD, DELHI in the accounts and admin department ;The Helping Hand ,Noida branch; Shamasha India , a company involved in manufacturing, importing, and trading of PCB plants and machinery, along with raw materials and consumables; Acutec global services, a payment modernization company headquartered in Noida; Mentify Organization- a pathway to wellbeing etc.

The duration of internships were for a period of one and two weeks or even a month. The students shared their learnings and experiences with their peers.

Our students participated enthusiastically and three teams were provided mentorship by Indian School of Business, Hyderabad under the programme Atal Catalysts @ ISB.

Team RNH of Radhika Singh (XII) and Harshita R (XII) was finally selected amongst Top 20 ideas for pitching to the panelists / sponsors.

45 innovative projects were submitted for ATL MARATHON, 2021, a flagship event under the aegis of Atal Innovation Mission, Niti Aayog and Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) to promote and foster scientific temper, coding skills, computational and design thinking in young minds.

20 students from the community and specially abled students also participated in this year's ATL Marathon.

- 1) Atal Tinkering Lab hosted अटल बाल विज्ञान प्रदर्शनी on 19 May, 2022 to celebrate World Telecommunication and Information Day. The event witnessed 14 projects catering to the domains of agriculture, environment, Space Sciences and innovations under disabled category. Students got an opportunity to exhibit their innovations and received valuable feedback for their prototypes from the Chief Guest, Mr. Soumitra Dey (Mentor of Change).

Community students (in an around Noida) numbering 17 also got a chance to attend the exhibition.

- 2) It is a matter of great pride that Team RNH comprising Harshita Ramrakhyani (XII) and Radhika Singh (XII) is one of the ten teams shortlisted by panelists of Big Pitch as the last step in the programme Atal Catalysts @ ISB by Indian School of Business under the aegis of Atal Innovation Mission. They have developed Learner's Mate, a student community platform where children acquire new knowledge and form social networks. This app has been funded by I-Venture @ ISB with Rs.25,000/-.

- 3) Change Makers Bootcamp was held at IIT Delhi campus for 30 shortlisted high schoolers from 23 May to 24 June to train them with rapid prototyping skills, digital fabrication techniques and electro-mechanical engineering.

Two students of our school, Kushagra Pant (X) and Samridhi Bisht (XII) were selected to attend the camp where they learnt skills like soldering, welding, 3D printing, laser cutting, drilling, etc and also visited labs at IIT Delhi. Parallel to this learning, they worked on their project, Somnolence Preventer (device for preventing drowsiness in drivers). On the concluding day, they displayed their project to visitors including the faculty of IIT Delhi and students.

- 4) Toycathon 2022, physical edition was organized by the Innovation Cell of the Ministry of Education (MoE). This two-day event was held on 24 - 25 May, 2022 and encompassed mentoring and evaluation rounds. Team "Indian Robo Companion Creators" including Kushagra Pant (XI), Janhavi Tandon (XI) and Charvi Adhikari (XI) exhibited their project in this forum. The team cleared evaluation rounds 1 and 2 to enter the "power grilling" Round-3 and stood in Top-10 out of the 34 participating teams at the National level.

- 5) STEMpedia & ART PARK (AI & Robotics Park) in collaboration with All India Educator Forum (AIEF) under the aegis of AIM, organized an International Bootcamp for educators all across the globe to increase the understanding of coding, Artificial Intelligence (AI), robotics and get hands-on experience on the latest technologies. Mr Umesh Verma, TGT (Science) successfully completed level – 1 of the bootcamp held between 20 June, 2022 to 26 June, 2022 and learnt about Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning concepts using PictoBlox with active participation in activities and projects.

To celebrate this occasion, AIM organized a Mega Tinkering Activity across all 10,000 Atal Tinkering Labs on 14 Nov, 2022 (Children's Day). During this event, all ATLs across India were guided to build a DIY Innovation Project together through live streaming by AIM. Rubik Cube Championship

The Semi Finals of Rubik Cube Championship was held on 22 Dec, 2022. It witnessed participation of 17 students from Category-1(Classses I-II) and 62 students from Category-2 (Classes III-V). The final round was held on 30 Jan, 2023.

Financial Literacy

In line with the vision, the staff of Pre Primary wing designed the 'Jadui Pitara' as an exemplar of activities that is needed by the students of Foundational Stage, comprising indigenous toys and games, puzzles, puppets, posters, flashcards, story cards and playbooks for students.

Keeping in line with the school's motto of 'Catch them Young', instruments like weighing balance, magnifying glass, magnets, spinning top, squeaky toys have also been included to instill Scientific-temperament, logical and analytical thinking taking a giant leap towards enriching the learning-teaching environment and making it more child-centric, lively and joyful for the Amrit Generation as envisioned in NEP 2020.

Bridging the Gap

In order to ensure a smooth transition of students from Pre Primary level to Class I, extra support classes were started w.e.f. 06 Feb, 2023. The classes are held everyday from 1.00 pm to 2.00 pm to help the students understand the concepts clearly, raising their level of comprehension of basic subjects and making a stronger foundation for fundamental literacy and numeracy. The initiative is certainly helping the children to cover up the learning gaps.

CENTRE FOR SCHOLASTIC INTEGRATION

Special efforts are being taken to integrate the students enrolled with learning disabilities.

1. Academics

- Online and offline Special Education Sessions were conducted by the Special Educators for the holistic development of children.
- The sessions were enriched with specialized practice worksheets and academic resources available on NCERT and Diksha Portal in order to increase the learning outcomes. Use of audio books developed by NCERT were also incorporated to aid the learning of CWSN.

2. Celebration of World Autism Awareness Day

World Autism Awareness Day was celebrated on 02 April 2022. To create awareness amongst the students and to honour Autism Awareness Day all students in the school wore blue colour. Also, the school building was lit in Blue. The school also displayed enriching creatives to support the day on various Social Media Platforms.

1. **Academics**

The period from 4 July – 23 August, 2022 was a period of examination and evaluation. The students of CFSI appeared for the following exams:

- During this period, the department was able to formulate the SOP's with regard to the working of the department, developing a standardized approach across school for referral of cases, and mechanisms for going ahead with the identified cases for academic and psychological well-being of students across school.
- The process of preliminary screening was followed by the development of a referral form for academic, and guidance counseling for teachers.

- Remedial classes for students with special needs were conducted in the month of May, July and August, 2022. The special educator ensured that there are no significant learning gaps among students with CWSN.

3. SPECIAL EDUCATION SESSIONS

- Online and offline sessions were conducted regularly by Special Educators for the comprehensive development of children with special needs.
- The sessions were made more interactive by using audio visual aids that have been recommended by NCERT and Diksha Portal.
- To hold the attention span of children with special needs sensory receptors like – clay, water games, sand games etc. along with puzzles were used.
- Peer mentoring and interactive teaching was encouraged to help the students increase their self-confidence.
- Special educators ensured that the mental and physical health of all students and their families is good.

4. SCREENINGS, OBSERVATIONS AND ASSESSMENTS

- Cases referred by the class teachers were subjected to the process of preliminary screenings, wherein the students were observed for a period of 10-15 days.
- The methodology adopted was naturalistic observations, academic, and functional assessments.
- Concerns with context to developmental milestones, academic difficulty, socio-emotional or any other cognitive domain were addressed through assessments.
- Parental interaction was held to carry out psychological assessments of these students.

5. CBSE ADOLESCENT SUMMIT 2022

The CBSE National Adolescent Summit on life skills, mental health and wellbeing took place at National Bal Bhavan, New Delhi from 15 to 17 Dec, 2022. The students participated in different competitions like mental health exhibition, Rhetoric's, Yuva Sansad and Movie screening. This platform gave the students an opportunity to put forward their understanding of mental health to others, they got to know the different aspects of mental health and how as peer educators they can help the students of CFSI. The school has 20 peer student educators to assist students of CFSI.

6. International Day of Persons with Disability

The CFSI department organized a weeklong event for the entire school on International Day for Persons with Disability. The observance of the Day aims to promote an understanding of disability issues and mobilize support for the dignity, rights and well-being of persons with disabilities.

The department organized multiple events like poster making, morning assembly, best out of waste and Online sessions to create awareness amongst the students about Inclusion and Disability.

A special assembly on the topic "kindness" was conducted by the students of the CFSI department. They spoke to their fellow students about the importance of kindness and how acts of kindness can make the world a happier place for everyone.

1. ACADEMICS

As on date, 27 students are enrolled with CFSI department with various disabilities. The Special Education sessions are conducted regularly to provide academic and overall support for the holistic development of children with special needs. Special education teachers ensure the mental and physical health of all students and their respective families.

2. ASSISTIVE TOOLS AND APPS USED BY THE DEPARTMENT

Assistive tools, apps, and technology play a crucial role in supporting the education and development of students with special needs. Some of the assistive tools being used by the school are :

- Audio books-DAISY (Digitally Accessible Information System) for visually impaired students. 2 students with visual impairment are enrolled with the department.
- E- pathshala app, a cost effective app for home education.
- Barkha – a reading series for all
- Picture exchange communication Board for the students with Autism spectrum disorder, to facilitate better communication.

3. SCREENINGS, OBSERVATIONS, AND ASSESSMENTS

- Prashasht- a tool used for screening Learning disability was circulated to teaching staff and workshops were conducted by special educators to create awareness among teachers, identify and help children with special needs. Also a checklist, as per DCPCR guidelines has been handed over to the teaching staff to identify early LD cases.
- The cases referred by the Class teachers are subjected to preliminary screenings, wherein the students are observed for a period of 10-15 days.
- The Counselor and the Special Educator hold the screening and the observations are discussed with the parents. As on date, the following data is being taken care of by the Special Educators.
 - Number of cases screened: 50
 - Number of cases referred for psychometric evaluation: 07
 - Number of cases under counseling: 33
 - Number of students for remedial classes: 10

Fortnightly follow-ups are being taken up as per the requirements of the case. The same has been communicated to the parents and class teachers.

4. WORLD AUTISM AWARENESS WEEK

The CFSI department organized a weeklong event for the entire school to commemorate World Autism Awareness day.

The observance of the Day aims to promote an understanding of Autism as a special need and mobilize support for the students.

5. PEER MENTORS (SERVICE BEFORE SELF):

More than 27 students have volunteered as 'peer mentors' who assist students of CFSI throughout the year by providing academic and social support.

It has been widely understood that class room transaction in academic subjects alone cannot foster development in all areas or help to develop life skills.

We take care to inculcate qualities such as Self Esteem, Positive Attitude and Life Skills of Creative and Critical Thinking by involving and giving our students various opportunities in Inter/ Intra School Competitions.

SCHOOL CLUBS

Environment Club

The Green Ambassadors of the school completed the Green School Programmeme Audit conducted by Centre for Science and Environment, New Delhi and submitted the report on 09 April, 2022.

Earth Day Celebration – Earth Day was celebrated with full enthusiasm from 4th April to 22 April, 2022. A plethora of activities were organized for the Primary, Middle wing, and Senior wings keeping in mind the theme of the Earth Day 'Invest in Earth'.

A Nukkad Natak 'Dharti ki Pukar' was performed in an endeavour to harness nature and create awareness. With the belief that we have taken the earth on lease from the future generation, a rejuvenating dance number was presented by the students.

The School Principal planted a sapling along with the green ambassadors and the students took the Earth Day pledge.

The school created Art work using plastic bottles , waste paper and wires to send across a message of the need to conserve and recycle resources.

The green brigade of the school participated in 'My Tree Programmeme' initiated by Tree Gaze. A number of activities like adopting and nurturing a plant, knowing the flora of the school Campus, bringing mass awareness through Nukkad Natak and watching a documentary were conducted.

The green brigade of the school got an opportunity to interact with the founder of Earth Day, Mr. Andrew Gabriel in a webinar hosted by the 'Tree Gaze' organization on 28 April. It was an enlightening session.

Under the aegis of My Tree Programmeme, a tree plantation activity was organized on 02 Sep, 2022. The Green Ambassadors of the school showcased the activities undertaken by the Environment Club of school.

An Anti cracker campaign and Harit Diwali Utsav was organized by the School from 11 - 24 Oct, 2022. Digital creatives were shared with parents and students via broadcast groups and circulated on social media platforms to create awareness about ways to celebrate eco-friendly Diwali. As a green practice, students of Class VI prepared rangoli using organic colors, and VII and VIII enthusiastically composed a rap song to propagate the mission of Harit Diwali. A Nukkad Natak was staged by the green ambassadors of Classes IX and X to spread awareness about ways to heal the planet through simple green practices. A rally was conducted in the school campus to disseminate information regarding the ill effects of firecrackers.

Earth Ko Anarth Se Bachaye

A Nukkad Natak "Dharti Ki Pukaar" was performed by a team of ten students (Class X) shortlisted by GRIHA COUNCIL (Green Rating For Integrated Habitat Assessment). The Natak was staged as flagship event of GRIHA Summit – Prelude Event – Paryavaran Rakshak Programmeme 2022 on 17 Nov, 2022 at India Habitat Centre, Delhi.

GRIHA Council is observing Paryavaran Rakshak Week during 14 Nov – 18 Nov, 2022. It aims to create awareness amongst the students to achieve the 2030 Sustainability Agenda.

A Nukkad Natak based on the theme "Earth Ko Anarth se Bachaye" was showcased by students of Classes IX and X in a prelude event "Paryavaran Rakshak Programmeme" GRIHA Summit 2022 at India Habitat Center on 18 Nov, 2022 which highlighted the need for the involvement of every citizen in sustainable growth and development.

THE SCHOOL TEAM WAS AWARDED A CONSOLATION AND A CASH PRIZE OF RS.5000/-.

The Environment Club students volunteered at the Industrial and Environment Club stall to learn Entrepreneurship skills by displaying a variety of planters and organic manure for sale at Hunar Bazar on 18 Dec, 2022.

THE GREEN GRADE POINTS OF THE SCHOOL END OF ACADEMIC SESSION (2022-23) ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. 40% of the school's energy consumption is met by solar energy.
2. 92% LED bulbs and tube light installation has been carried out as on date in the school building.
3. 75% use of sustainable mode of transportation has been adopted by the school.
4. School has outsourced CNG buses for transportation. There are no diesel operated vans and buses used to ferry students.
5. 70% green area is maintained in spite of multiple activities on the ground.
6. This is a complete ban on junk food and single-use plastics.
7. Float valves have been installed in water tanks and school has a dual flush system in toilets.
8. Channelized waste RO water is used to flush the toilets.
9. Rainwater harvesting system is operational.
10. Local bio species have been planted to increase the green area of the school.
11. The school has been a consistent leader in generating mass awareness about Planet Earth.
12. The School has a Waste Management policy and educates the masses about the methodology to segregate wet waste and dry waste.

OUR GREEN FUTURE GOALS AND VISION (2023-24)

1. 100% solar energy-driven school
2. Installation of a Small Biogas generating system to generate biogas through wet waste, to supply gas to the kitchen
3. 100% LED bulbs and tube light installation will be achieved by May, 2023.
4. Donate 10 bicycles to needy children for a sustainable mode of transportation
5. Increase the green area of School with increased Vertical gardening
6. Replacement of chemical cleaners with Bio enzyme cleaners in Swimming Pool
7. Installation of sensor taps to reduce water wastage by December, 2023.
8. To replace gadgets with a 3-star or 5-star rating which are 100% energy-efficient gadgets.
9. Channelizing AC water to the water collection source point for reuse and watering of plants.

World Sustainable Development Summit (WSDS)

The 22 edition of the annual flagship event of The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI), the World Sustainable Development Summit (WSDS) was held from 22-24 February 2023 in New Delhi. The Summit focused on the umbrella theme- Mainstreaming Sustainable Development and Climate Resilience for Collective Action.

- The G20 summit is critical to finding climate solutions through the proper implementation of sustainability goals. Paradigm shifts are needed to alter consumption patterns and globalize lifestyle changes.
- **Mr. Abhinav Singh, Director**, Amazon India said, "Addressing climate change requires a virtuous cycle. It starts with a bold commitment, goes on to the investment, and then deliberate actions. It is required not just by the organization or the government, but by all levels of society.
- For a green circular economy, redesigning consumption and production requires rethinking both policy and business models. Schools and institutions will play a key role by inculcating green practices in the coming generations and building skills to combat climate change. The shift in curriculum having skills to deal with real-life problems will be a solution to the climate crisis.

Ms Neerja Bhatnagar, I/C Eco-club attended the Summit on behalf of the School Principal.

Health and Wellness Club

A vaccination camp in the age group of 12-14 yrs and 15- 18 yrs was organised in the Sick Bay of the School on 22 April, 2022. Children between 12 and 14 yrs were administered Corbivax vaccine and children between 15 and 18 yrs were administered Covaxin in the medical room of BBPS, Noida by the health workers deputed by CMO, G.B.Nagar. 664 / 887 students in 15 – 18 age group have received the second dose of Covaxine. In the 12 – 14 age group, 178 / 227 students have taken their first dose of Covaxin. Entire staff of the school is fully vaccinated as on date.

Health Alert on Chamki fever – Encephalitis, was released from Principal's desk on 22 April, 2022 with an appeal to all concerned to support the school in taking measures to control mosquitoes.

World Health Day was observed on 07 April, 2022 on the theme 'Our Planet Our Health'. A webinar on the same theme was held in online mode for Classes VI to XII.

Key note speaker Ms Surbhi Bhalla along with nutritionist Ms Ritika Samadaar from Max group of Hospitals spoke about the importance of good diet and physical health regime for children. School alumni, Mr Saurabh Kaura, Specialist, Introcept, Sydney, Australia, elaborated on the mental health issues plaguing adolescents and laid emphasis on the need to 'open up' and sharing one's thoughts, as one of the best solution to all problems.

Parent Panelist, Mr Sahoo joined from Saudi Arabia and was quite appreciative of the exposure that the school provided to children for their overall well being.

World Blood Donor Day was observed by the school on 14 June, 2022. On this occasion, a Blood Donation camp was organized in Medical Room under the aegis of Rotary Club, Noida. 100 units of blood was collected and donated to the Blood Bank of the district.

A 5 day CBSE programme on 'First Aid & Medical Emergency Care in Schools' was attended by Vice Principal, Mrs Anupama Motwani, Ms Vidhi Oberoi, TGT (Biology) and Ms Palak Goel, PRT (Maths). All were awarded certificates for successfully finishing the hands on training imparted by the resource team on 27 June, 2022.

A mega vaccination camp for the parents, staff members and students was held in the Medical Room of the school on 08 July, and 06 August, 2022. 168 doses of vaccines were administered by the staff of CMO, Gautam Buddha Nagar.

938/1097 eligible students from Classes VII to XII as on date are fully vaccinated with Corbevax and Covaxin (as applicable). 50 Staff members including administrative staff members were administered the booster dose in school premises.

Under the aegis of Procter and Gamble, an adolescent advocacy programme on Health and 'Hygiene during Menstruation' was held for girls and mothers of Classes V to VII on 06 August, 2022.

Under the aegis of CBSE and DIOS, G B Nagar, Swachhata Pakhwada was observed by the School students from 01 to 15 Sep, 2022. The Pakhwada Kickstarted with the students of Classes I-XII taking a Swachhata Pledge, which was followed by plethora of activities with an objective to educate students about the importance of personal and community hygiene.

A pilot project on 'Climate change game activation for cleaner air' was initiated in Class IX in collaboration with HRIDAY, an NGO and Public Health Foundation of India on 04 Nov, 2022. The students made informed choices to build a city with the best possible air quality. The students participated in the game enthusiastically.

Health advisory for students, parents and surrounding community on 'Dengue' and 'Air Pollution' was released from Principals desk on 05 Nov, 2022.

- The CBSE National Adolescent Summit on Life Skills, Mental Health Safety and Wellbeing was held in collaboration with Expressions India from 15- 17 Dec, 2022 at National Bal Bhavan, New Delhi. The three days event was attended by School Counselor Ms. Philo Maria and Students of Health Club.

Students participated in plethora of competitions and activities on all three days. The follow up of the programme attended by the students is as follows :

1. To inculcate essential life skills to develop healthy attitudes and responsible behaviour.
 2. Identifying their social skills in terms of their ability to making friends, resolving conflicts, respecting friends and showing appreciation.
 3. Increasing decision-making skills, which include moral and situational analysis skills
 4. Encourage mutual and collective efforts to develop, promote and apply life skills to improve quality of education and learning through interdisciplinary and trans- disciplinary approaches.
 5. Learning to talk, accept and manage emotions.

The school is familiarizing all classes with simple dialogues in all 22 languages under Schedule VIII of the Constitution of India, taking up one language every week, to enhance linguistic tolerance and promote national integration. Special assemblies have been scheduled to implement the same.

The fourth edition of the Ganga Quest for the age group above 10 years commenced on **07 April, 2022** (World Health Day) and concluded on **22 May, 2022** (International Day for Biological Diversity). The students of Classes VI-X participated in the quiz.

Ganga Quest: Ganga Quest is a Bilingual International Quiz competition designed to sensitize people about the national River Ganga, its significance, its cultural and historical values, its diversity, and its ecosystem.

The fourth edition of the Ganga Quest for the age group above 10 years commenced on 07 Apr, 2022 (World Health Day) and concluded on 22 May, 2022 (International Day for Biological Diversity). Students of Classes VI-X participated in the quiz.

Sanskrit Day was celebrated on **12 August, 2022**. Students of Classes Pre School to Primary wing, enthusiastically chanted various Sanskrit Shlokas and Vedic Mantras. Class VI to XII students participated in various activities, such as defining sanskrit names of the household items. Introduction to Natural resources in Sanskrit, Mottos of various Indian Institutions and Public Awareness Messages in Sanskrit were taught to the children, Greetings messages and Greeting card making was a part of Sanskrit curriculum.

Mission Shakti: Mission Shakti Phase-4 is all about the implementation of the 100-day Action plan. It's a special campaign

for the safety, dignity, and self-reliance of women and girls. This campaign is a priority programme of the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh. Students of Classes VI-VIII prepared a play showcasing 'gender sensitivity' which was a medium to spread awareness in the society about 'gender equality'.

Poster Making Competition on National Flag, for Classes I to III was organized on 15 July, 2022. The objective of the competition was to ignite the fire of imagination and creativity in the students.
