The Human Rights Day is annually celebrated worldwide on 10th December each year to commemorate the United Nations General Assembly's adoption of the Charter of Universal Human Rights on 10 December 1948. These rights are held inalienable for every individual irrespective of their race, class, caste, creed, gender and religion. Human rights describe the universality of sanctity of human life and lead it with dignity, respect and without fear.

Students understood the universal importance of basic rights and fundamental freedom. They were sensitized that human rights are inherent to all human beings and equally applicable to everyone, irrespective of gender, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, language, or any other status. The students made a commitment to upholding dignity and justice for all.
