BAN ON DRIVING OF VEHICLES IN PUBLIC PLACES BY MINORS

Dear Parents,

The Uttar Pradesh government vide order number CAMP / 40601-40697/2023-24 dated 02 January 2024 has banned those below 18 years of age from driving two wheelers and four wheelers. The order issued by the Department of Transportation states that majority of individuals losing their lives in road accidents are usually under 18 years of age. According to the Department of Transportation, some students in high school and intermediate classes use scooters or other vehicles and are often seen driving recklessly, causing a constant fear of injury to themselves and others.

In view of this, a ban has been imposed on driving of vehicles in public places by any minor.

- Driving a vehicle by a minor will result in penalties for the vehicle owner. Under this provision, the vehicle owner can face up to 3 years of imprisonment and a fine of 25,000.
- If parents allow children to drive scooty or car, they will be punished with three years of imprisonment and a fine of Rs 25,000.
- Section 5 of the Motor Vehicles Act 1988 stipulates that if someone does not have a valid license, the owner of the vehicle will not allow the person to drive the vehicle nor will grant permission for it. In such cases, the registration of the vehicle used in the commission of the offence will be cancelled for one year.

Following the instructions issued by the government, no student of BBPS Noida will be allowed to travel to and fro school on a self-driven two wheeler or four wheeler, strict action will be initiated against wrongdoers in compliance with the govt orders.

We request Parental cooperation in keeping our children safe.
