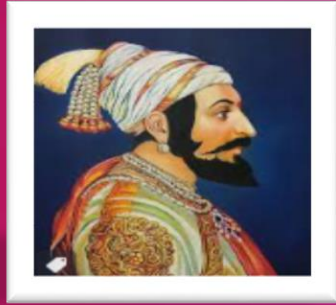

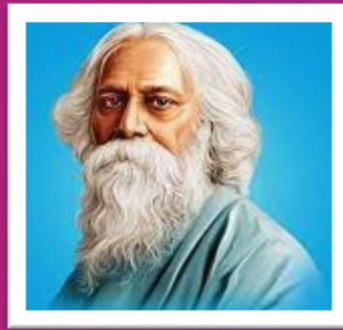

* Attendance will be considered at the year end and will have a weightage of 05 Marks.

* IT & AI and G.K & V.E will be assessed in the Half Yearly and Final Exam for 60 and 50 marks respectively & will be graded as A, B & C.

* VISUAL ARTS, PERFORMING ARTS, PHYSICAL EDUCATION & WORK EDUCATION will be graded as A, B & C.

ATTENDANCE

Every student must have a minimum of 75% attendance, failing which he/she will not be allowed to sit in the final examination / will not be promoted to the next higher class. Please discourage the student from missing an exam unless on grounds of extreme emergency like a contagious disease, a fracture etc.



PROMOTION & MISMASTER POLICY 2024-25

PROMOTION POLICY

- 1. Attendance**
 - (a) 75% attendance is mandatory for promotion to the next higher class.
 - (b) 15% shortage in attendance can be condoned on account of Medical grounds (To be validated with Medical Certificate)
 - (c) Case of a candidate with attendance less than 60% shall be put up to the Principal for condonation.
2. To be promoted to the next higher class a student must secure 33% marks in the aggregate and a minimum of 33% in both Pen Paper test and Internal Assessment Exams taken together.
3. A student scoring less than 33% (Cumulative) in 03 or more subjects will be detained in the same class.
4. For Classes VI to IX, a student scoring less than 33% marks(Cumulative) in one or two subjects will be given Compartment.
5. A student appearing for Compartment Exam must score 33% marks in the Compartment Exam to be promoted to the next higher class failing which he/she will be placed in 'ESSENTIAL REPEAT CATEGORY'.
6. In order to be promoted to the next higher class, it is mandatory for student to obtain a minimum B Grade in Art Education/ Performing Art / Health and Physical Education.
7. It is mandatory for a student to pass in the additional subject in class IX as per passing criteria. For students who are unable to meet the passing criteria, retest will be scheduled. Failure to fulfill the passing criteria after retest will lead to surrender of the additional subject in Class X.
8. If any student fails in any one of the three elective subjects (i.e. Science, Mathematics and Social Science), and passes in the Skill subject (offered as a 6th additional subject (A./ FMM/IT), then that subject will be replaced by the Skill subject and the result of Class IX Examination will be computed accordingly.

MISMASTER POLICY

- CASE-1** Missed a Periodic test due to participation in the Inter-School Competitions (Sports/Co-Scholastic)
- POLICY** Eligible for Mismuster Exam in the concerned subject.
- CASE-2** Missed a Periodic test for being medically indisposed (e.g. ill, accident or fracture- minimum of two days leave).
- POLICY** Eligible for Mismuster Exam in the concerned subject.
- NOTE** The school policy stated above is subject to submission of an application the same day through school email and Medical Certificate from a registered practitioner along with an application addresses to the Principal, within 48Hrs of joining School.
- CASE-3** Missed a Periodic test due to death in the immediate family.
- POLICY** Eligible for Mismuster exam in the respective subject. Subject to submission of application through school email within a day to the school. The school authority has the right to ascertain the facts in its own way to arrive at a conclusion for according the Mismuster Exam.
- CASE-4** Missed a test due to marriage in the family, travelling outstation or any other personal reasons other than stated above.
- POLICY** There will be no Mismuster Examination. The Report Card will show the status of missed test as 'ABSENT'.
- CASE-5** New admission (VI to VIII)
- POLICY** No Mismuster Exam will be held for the new admission cases of Classes VI-VIII.
- CASE-6** If Half Yearly / Annual Exam is missed in any subject/s, eligible students to be tested along with the Compartment Cases.(Cases 1,2 and 3).

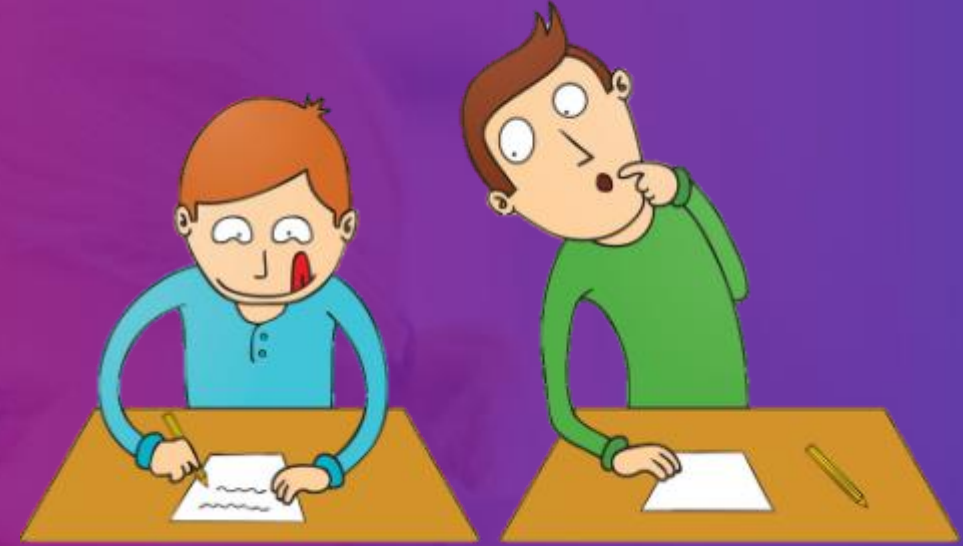

REDUCTION IN WEIGHT OF THE SCHOOL BAG

The primary and the middle school staff has been instructing students to restrict the number of text books and note books being brought to the school on a daily basis so as to reduce the load of the school bag thereby making 'Learning without Burden'. MEDICAL DETAILS

MEDICAL ALERT NOTIFICATION

- Parents are required to download the Medical Alert Notification Proforma from the School Website <http://bbpsnoida.balbharati.org/download-forms-docs/> and submit the same with essential documents to the Class Teacher of the child latest by 30 April, 2024.
- Also, in case of a long sickness of more than 2-3 days, the school needs to be informed through an e-mail / letter, addressed to the School Principal, with regard to the nature of illness and the number of days the student is likely to be away from school. Keeping the safety and well-being of all our students, parents are requested that students suffering from cold, cough, fever or any other contagious diseases should not be sent to school, till the mandatory period of quarantine is over.
- **A FITNESS CERTIFICATE BY A REGISTERED MEDICAL PRACTITIONER NEEDS TO BE SUBMITTED WHEN THE CHILD RESUMES SCHOOL AFTER A PROLONGED ILLNESS.**

REGULARITY & PUNCTUALITY

- Child must reach school at least 05 minutes in advance (07.45 a.M).
- 75% attendance is mandatory as per C.B.S.E. Rules.
- If there is a genuine requirement, his / her absence must be supported by a leave application, preferably through school e-mail and diary.
- No half day leave will be permitted.
- Lunch box will not be accepted after the child has entered the school due to safety reasons.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Students have a right to feel safe in the school, learn in a challenging environment to the best of their ability, be treated with respect by other students and teachers and be listened to. However, they must also adhere to the following code of conduct:

Respect for the Institution

- ❖ Keep the buildings, class-rooms, corridors and grounds clean in good condition. Spend five minutes prior to beginning of every class cleaning your surroundings.
- ❖ Students are expected to treat school property with care and respect. This includes school playfields, lawns, buildings, equipment, books, transportation vehicles and possession of others. Don't cause destruction, defacement or damage to school properties. Graffiti on walls, doors or furniture is strictly prohibited.
- ❖ Carefully handle the equipment, fixtures and appliances of the labs. Careless handling/misuse of the above could result in personal injuries or damage to property. In the event of damage of property, the responsible students will have to bear the cost of replacement/repair with fine.
- ❖ No student shall enter or leave the class room when the session is on without the permission of the teacher concerned. The students are not permitted to leave school campus during school hours without prior parental and administrative permission.
- ❖ Share information with school officials regarding matters which may endanger the safety/health or welfare of the school community.
- ❖ Care must be taken to observe the "green rules" in order to maintain clean, green surroundings. That is, school premises will not be littered with disposable tumblers, papers or polythene bags.
- ❖ Students are expected to conserve water and electricity.

RESPECT FOR LEARNING

- ❖ Be punctual and regular in attendance and make efforts to maximize achievements in all areas of Education.
- ❖ Enter or leave the class with prior permission. Take progressive responsibility and ownership for your own learning. Complete tasks as allotted.
- ❖ Complete class work and homework assignments on time.
- ❖ Keep library books in good condition.
- ❖ Assemblies are planned and scheduled for educational and informational purposes throughout the school year.

Students must adhere to guidelines as mentioned:

- ❖ a) Stand to the assembly in an orderly manner.
- ❖ b) Be respectful to guests and speakers.
- ❖ c) Upon dismissal, leave the assembly in an orderly manner.
- ❖ Inform parents of educational progress and to ensure that all school communication is effectively delivered.
- ❖ Show respect to teachers & elders & consideration for peers. Seek clarification or guidance in a polite manner.

There should be no rowdyism or shouting.

- ❖ Do not use unfair means during assessments/examinations.

RESPECT FOR SELF

- Dress neatly and properly as per schools' norms.
- Highlighting and dyeing of hair, permanent tattoos, jewelry items, fancy nails, eye or face makeup, fancy shoes are not allowed.
- Carrying mobile phones, Smart watches, iPods, electronic equipment, valuable articles and cash more than Rs.500/- to school is prohibited.

Respect for Others

- Be tolerant and respectful of diversity.
- Behave in a manner which does not endanger the health and safety of self or others.
- Behave with courtesy and consideration for others. In particular, students must refrain from all forms of bullying, violence, verbal intimidation and harassment.
- Students must strive to resolve all conflicts by peaceful means.
- Demonstrate respectful behavior in classroom. Refrain from behavior which would disrupt classroom instruction. Do not instigate other co-students or juniors to indulge in any misbehavior or any form of anti-school activity which will bring disrepute to the school and could spoil the career of the concerned student.

WHILE USING INTERNET BASED TECHNOLOGY THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES NEED TO BE ADHERED TO:

- Privacy – Users shall not intentionally seek information on or obtain copies of data or files belonging to another person unless authorized by that person.
- Passwords – Users shall not seek passwords or use passwords belonging to another person unless authorized and users shall take precautions to secure access of their personal password from others.
- Security: Users shall not attempt to infiltrate a computing system or network or alter the software components of a computing system or network or import files, which will jeopardize the security of the computing system or the network; and users shall not load software on computers without permission of a Computer Teacher.
- Unauthorized use of wifi to download any videos/documents is not allowed.
- Uploading any objectionable material on social media or circulating such material through mobile networks is a serious offence.

THE FOLLOWING, IF OBSERVED, SHALL BE LIABLE FOR STRICT DISCIPLINARY ACTION AND MAY LEAD TO EXPULSION FROM SCHOOL.

- Substance Abuse/Possession or smoking/Physical abuse
- Truancy
- Display of aggression and violence
- Bullying, use of foul language, vulgar behavior and eve teasing
- Driving any two wheeler/ four wheeler to school
- Any form of gambling
- Association with banned organizations
- Possession of any weapon or use of any implement as weapon causing injury to a person or damage to property.
- Deliberate damage to school property or infrastructure.
- Theft/Pilferage of Schools'/Students' property.

SPECIFIC CASES OF INDISCIPLINE

Long absence without intimation

If a student remains absent for more than a week without informing the school, attention of the parents would be drawn to it in writing, asking the reason for absence.

Name to be struck off

If a student remains absent without good reason for more than a month, his name shall be struck off the rolls after giving due notice. Re-admission may be considered by the Principal.

Using unfair means

Incase cheating is noticed, the Answer sheet(s) shall be cancelled. Fresh answer book will be given. Parents would be notified about the incident and action taken.

For repetition of cheating, more drastic action shall be considered.

- Presently 23 routes of the Primary and Senior School and 06 routes of the Pre Primary are operational.
- The State and Supreme Court guidelines to run the transport are strictly adhered by the school.
- The Transport Safety Checklist as per the State / CBSE Guidelines is followed by the staff on duty.
- There are 15 Lady Guards and 06 Sahayikas who along with the teaching staff remain on morning and afternoon duties for safety and security of students.
- The drivers of Private Vans ferrying students of the school are briefed on safety and security norms issued by the State Govt.

- ❖ Parents are to regularly monitor the assignments and if unchecked for a long time then it is to be brought to the notice of the class teacher.

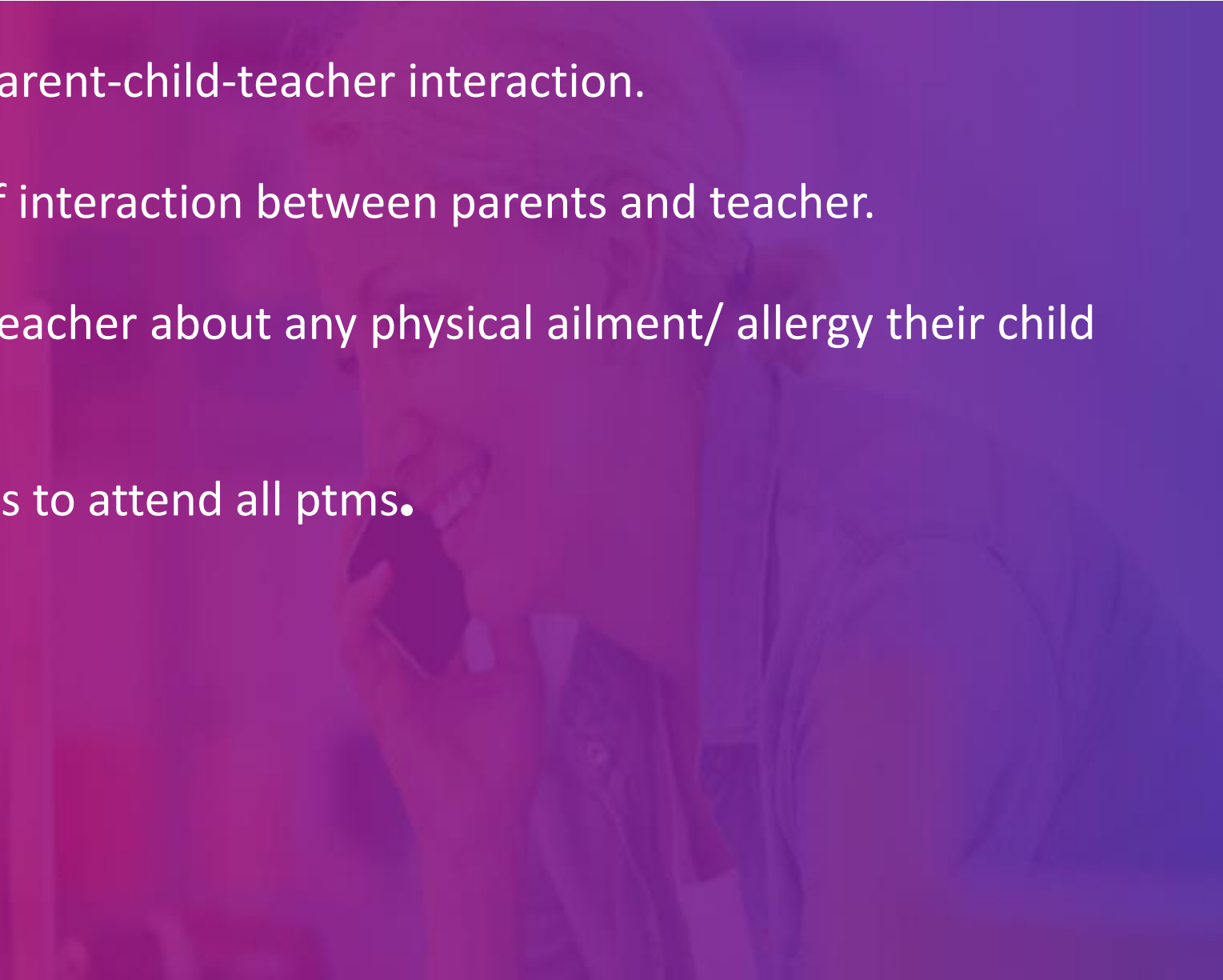

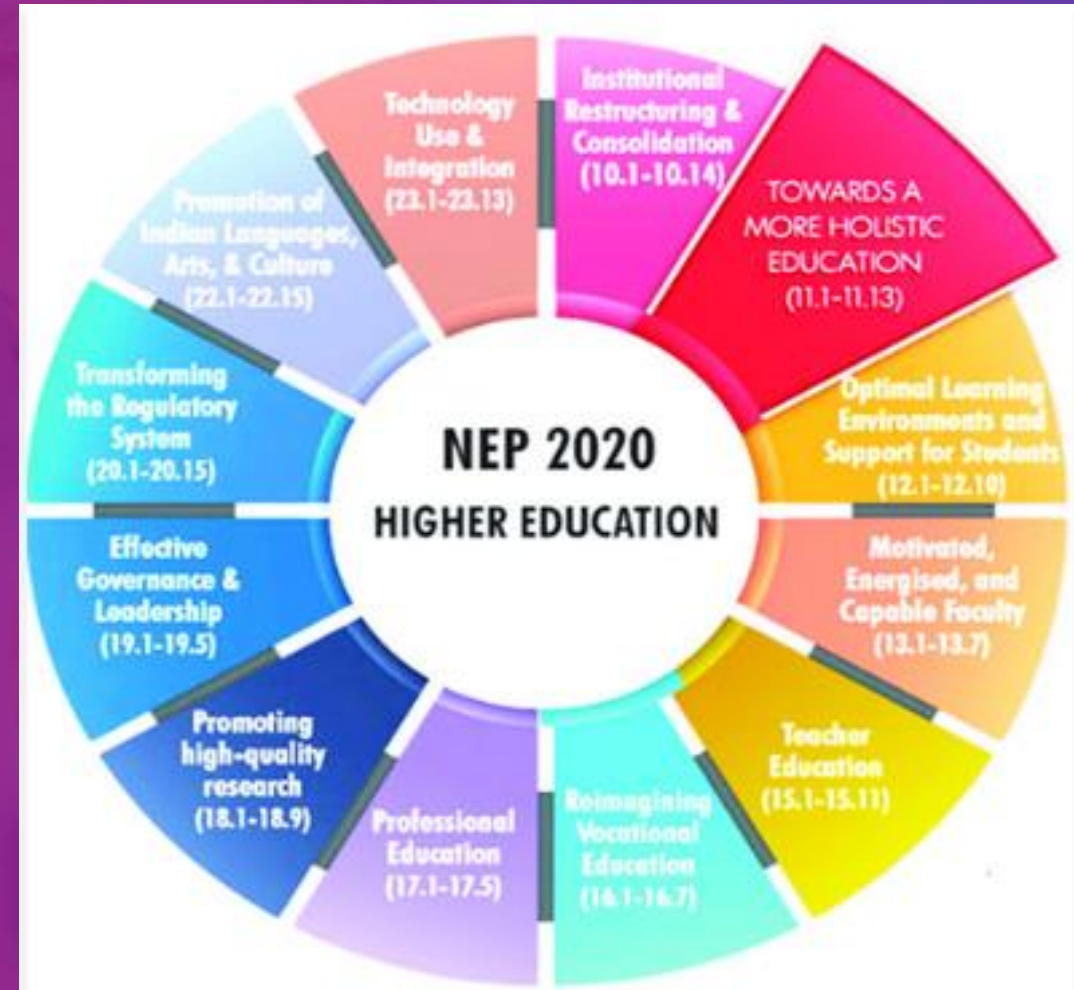


NATIONAL CREDIT FRAMEWORK

- ❖ The National Education policy (NEP) 2020 envisions a transformational shift in the education system of India.
- ❖ The policy focuses on developing the conceptual understanding and critical skills.
- ❖ NCrF is the framework formulated for a unified credit accumulation and transfer for all forms of education in India.
- ❖ NCrF will be implemented in schools with effect from 2025-2026.
- ❖ Further guidelines are awaited.

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KEY PRINCIPLES OF NATIONAL CREDIT FRAMEWORK

- ❖ The NCrF is the framework formulated for a unified credit accumulation and transfer for all forms of education in India.
- ❖ This framework will allow students to earn credits towards by demonstrating their knowledge and skills in a variety of subjects and activities.
- ❖ The framework is designed to be "enabling" rather than regulatory, leveraging the existing strengths and resources of regulatory bodies and autonomous institutions like universities, state school boards, state technical boards, and NIOS.
- ❖ The NCrF recognizes the pervasiveness and benefits of online and distance learning and incorporates these modes of education as well.

TENTATIVE CREDITS ALLOTTED FOR EACH SUBJECT IN CLASSES VI

(FOR PILOT PHASE ONLY) ARE AS PROPOSED AS FOLLOWS

Below mentioned steps are to be followed by the piloting schools for implementing NCrf in class VI:

- Attendance of students must be made mandatory. Minimum attendance in a session must be 75%.
- The hours allocated to each academic year and credits earned per year is fixed.
{As per NCrf, total Notional Learning Hours for assignment of credits across school education, higher education and vocational education/skilling have been agreed to be 1200 hours per year for which the students/ learners shall be awarded 40 credits i.e., 30 Notional Learning Hours will be counted as one credit.}
- The curriculum of each subject must be divided as per the hours allotted.
- The credits shall be reflected in the Marks Statement/ Grade Card for final examinations, alongwith Marks and Grades
- The credits earned shall be deposited in the Academic Bank of Credit of a student which will be linked with the APAAR Id and DigiLocker of the student, in future.
- Credits can only be earned in full or No credit, i.e., student can earn full credits upon passing a subject after assessment or No credit for not fulfilling the assessment criteria.
- Tentative credits allotted for each subject in classes VI (for pilot phase only) are as proposed as follows:**
