Step 5: Write the "About" Section

1. Describe Yourself:

 - Highlight achievements like awards, club memberships, or hobbies.
 - Example:

"I am a Class 12 student at Bal Bharati Public School, Noida, with a keen interest in technology and innovation. I actively participate in robotics competitions and have won the inter-school Hackathon. I aim to pursue computer science and contribute to solving real-world problems."

Step 6: Add Your Education

1. Mention Your School:
 - Add the name, location, and dates (e.g., 2020 – Present).
2. Highlight Academic Achievements:
