On March 29, 2025, Bal Bharati Public School, Noida, reaffirmed its commitment to student health and wellness by organizing the Cervical Cancer Suraksha Sankalp, an HPV vaccination camp in association with the Rotaract Club of Delhi South East, collaboration with Motherland Hospital, Noida, Sponsored by the Rotary Club South Delhi. With over 300 students aged 9 to 26 years receiving the Cervical or Penile cancer vaccine, this initiative was a landmark step in raising awareness and providing protection against HPV-related five cancers, including cervical and penile cancer.
